Local Organizations Unite to Donate Ten Commandments Posters to Every Classroom in Montgomery County

WILLIS, TX – In a bold and unifying show of faith and community support, Love Heals Youth, the Liberty Library Project, Lake Conroe Area Republican Women, Liberty Bells, and a growing coalition of local churches are joining forces to ensure the successful implementation of Texas Senate Bill 10 (SB 10), recently passed by the 89th Texas Legislature. The bill requires the display of the Ten Commandments in every public school classroom across the state.

This community-led initiative aims to provide high-quality, laminated, legally compliant Ten Commandments posters—free of charge—to every classroom in Montgomery County’s six public school districts. Each poster is printed precisely according to the stipulations of SB 10, including size, durability, visibility, and the verbatim King James Version text.

“This effort is not about imposing beliefs. It’s about restoring foundational values—truth, morality, and personal accountability—that have shaped generations of American students,” said Rebecca Smith at the July 9th school board presentation.

The first formal presentation and donation offer was made at the Willis ISD school board meeting Wednesday evening, coordinated in partnership with Trustee Williams and Mrs. Blakelock. The group emphasized that this is a grassroots, faith-based effort—not tied to one organization but driven by a shared mission among “brothers and sisters in Christ.”

Goals and Impact:

- 10,000 posters distributed by September 1, 2025
- Coverage for every classroom in Montgomery County
- Excess funds to be used for Bible donations to school libraries

This countywide effort is a testament to what can happen when churches, nonprofits, and families unite around a common goal: restoring timeless values and truth to the hearts and minds of the next generation.
