Chaplain Course Books and Exams

We will provide two Chaplain Course of Booklets and Exams:

1. The first Course of Study teaches the Ministerial Biblical as a Chaplain.
2. The Second Chaplain Ministry Guidebook teaches the functions; do's and don'ts and duties of a Chaplain.

Each course of study consists of 50 multiple choice questions for a total of 100 questions.

Passing overall grade is 80% and above.

If a candidate does not pass the Chaplain Exam, they will be given more opportunities to redo the exam before the due date of graduation ceremony, should they wish to attend.

If this admirable profession sounds like the right fit for you, you'll need to pursue certification by a nationally recognized chaplaincy certification board.

What is a Chaplain Program?

Chaplaincy training programs can be found at colleges and universities; many of these programs are master's degree programs designed to train you to work in businesses, crisis centers, hospices and schools. Courses may include **counseling theory, theology and officiating religious ceremonies.**

Is a Chaplain the same as a pastor?

Defining the Roles of Chaplains and Pastors. Chaplains and pastors play a significant role in the lives of diverse groups of people. They are **both theologically educated and certified ministers**.... An easy way to remember the difference is that while all chaplains are pastors, not all pastors are chaplains.

Be trustworthy and able to maintain confidentiality.

One of your main duties as a chaplain will be counseling those under spiritual distress. When people come to you for help, they will share sensitive details with you with the expectation that you keep that information between the two of you. Just as a counselor or psychiatrist is expected to remain confidential, you will be expected to do the same. A chaplain who cannot be trusted will soon lose his potency and effectiveness.

Vision and Goal as a Chaplain

Being a Chaplain has always inspired me to pursue this vision. Five years of experience with the Sacramento Law-Enforcement Community Chaplaincy has allowed me to keep my vision and commitment to help those who are struggling in crisis and trauma.

I am strongly passionate about displaying and depositing the gifts of motivation, emotional, and spiritual support for the patient, as well as support for the patient's family and friends.

Desiring and deciding to become a Certified Chaplain and have a Chaplaincy Program for local communities and the USA is my intended goal.
