Welcome to the beginning of your flight training journey! We're excited that you're considering pursuing your Private Pilot License with us. Whether you're just getting started or thinking long-term about a professional pilot career, our goal is to provide you with a supportive, structured, and encouraging environment to help you succeed.

Learning to fly is an incredibly rewarding adventure, but it can also feel like a major undertaking at times. You will experience both challenges and "aha moments" throughout your training. This is completely normal. Every student progresses at their own pace, and it's important to trust the process, stay consistent, and allow yourself to grow. With dedication and regular flying, you will begin to see your hard work pay off.

Getting Started: The Private Pilot Process

To receive your Private Pilot License, you must meet several FAA requirements. First, you must be at least 17 years old to receive your certificate, though you may fly solo at age 16. You will need to obtain at least a valid Third Class Medical, secure a Student Pilot License, and pass the FAA Private Pilot Knowledge Test. You must also complete a minimum of 40 flight hours, including dual instruction with an instructor, solo flight time, and general proficiency-building flight experience. Although the FAA establishes 40 flight hours as the minimum, 70 flight hours is the national average to acquire the Private Pilot's License. It is very common that students require additional time to reach the necessary level of comfort, competence, and safety—this is expected and completely normal.

Your Recommended Training Order

So, how do we meet those requirements? The first step we recommend is booking an introductory Discovery Flight. This introductory flight allows you to experience what flying is really like and ensures that it aligns with your expectations. After that, the next priority is obtaining your Medical Certificate (third-class minimum) from an FAA-designated Aviation



Medical Examiner. Once your medical is complete, you should apply for your Student Pilot License through the FAA's IACRA system. An instructor will assist you with this process. Before beginning flight lessons, we strongly encourage signing up for Cessna Flight Training King School's ground knowledge course and if possible, completing your FAA Knowledge Test. Students who get the written exam out of the way early tend to train more efficiently, gain confidence faster, and finish in fewer overall hours. Once that's complete, the most important factor becomes your training frequency. Flying consistently—ideally two to three times per week—greatly improves your retention and reduces your total training cost. Something to keep in mind is that flights are weather dependent, so it is often a good idea to schedule more than you plan to fly. This helps prevent a large gap in flight training due to weather days. After determining a schedule that works for you in coordination with your instructor, you'll be ready to begin booking lessons and progressing through your training.

Estimated Private Pilot Training Costs

Your training includes several key components: aircraft rental, flight instruction with a flight instructor, and ground instruction. Each element contributes to your preparation for the FAA checkride. You should also plan for additional expenses such as a ground course, the FAA Knowledge Test fee, and the Designated Pilot Examiner fee for your final practical test. These costs vary per person, but the national average is around \$20,000 to get your PPL.

discussed with the instructor in advance so as to acquire the item most suited to the individual student. Additional resources may be referenced during training, in which case the instructor will provide guidance on how to obtain access.

In addition to the resources listed above it is <u>highly recommended</u> to have an iPad with cellular and wi-fi service paired with a subscription to <u>ForeFlight</u>. STUDENT/CUSTOMER CODE OF CONDUCT

After each flight, please take a few minutes to ensure the aircraft is in good condition for the next customer:

- Fuel Aircraft (Mandatory if Tanks Are Less Than ½ Full)
- Clean Windshield and Leading Edges of Wings with Prist and Wipes *Note: Windshields should be wiped in vertical (up and down) motions. Horizontal and circular wiping motions cause glares*
- Replenish Oil (As Needed Refer to Aircraft Checklist for Desired Quantity)
- Insert Windshield Cover (Mandatory During Warmer Months)
- Ensure the Following Items are Locked and/or Secured
 - -Yoke Lock
 - -Throttle Lock
 - -Engine Cowling Plugs
 - -Pitot Tube Cover
 - -Tied Down Properly
 - -Aircraft is Locked
- Wipe Down and Return Headset if Borrowed. *Note: DO NOT PLACE YOUR HEADSET ON THE DASHBOARD AS THIS WILL SCRATCH THE WINDSHIELD*
- Remove All Trash and Personal Items
- Return Keys and Check-In at Front Desk

There will be a \$25.00 charge to the student/customer if the above items are not completed after each flight.
