

# Wyomissing Hills Pool Rules and Regulations

In order to ensure a safe environment for our members and guests, the following rules are in affect and will be enforced:

All members and guests are required to obey the following water safety rules:

Obey all life guards and staff members.

No one may be in the water without a lifeguard on duty at the poolside.

No diving in shallow water and areas marked "NO DIVING".

No water wings and flotation devices in the diving well.

If a swimmer cannot swim one lap of the diving well they cannot swim in the diving well.

No swimming in the diving well when there are people using the diving boards.

Only one person is allowed on the diving boards and slide at one time, this includes the stairs. Swimmers must go down the slide feet first on their backs.

No water balloons allowed in the pool.

No hanging or swimming on the ropes or lane lines.

No swimming in the lap lane unless you are swimming laps.

Do not sit on, lean on or plug the baby pool fountain.

Children older than 6 years of age are not permitted in the baby pool.

No running, pushing or horse play.

No profanity.

No glass containers allowed anywhere.

No alcoholic beverages at any time.

No smoking on pool grounds.

Firearms or other weapons are not permitted on pool grounds.

The staff of the Wyomissing Hills Swimming Association is responsible to provide supervision to members and guests while they are in the water and on the pool deck. Our staff is not responsible for the supervision of members and guests in other areas of the pool grounds. Children entering the 5th grade, at the discretion of the parent/guardian, may use the pool unaccompanied by an adult. Children 4th grade and younger must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

All young children must be supervised by an adult when using the baby pool and playground facilities.

All guests must be accompanied by a member.

Members are responsible for their guests.

Guest fees are charged to all guests over the age of 2.

Guest fees may be prorated after 6:00 pm.

Members are encouraged to keep the pool clean by disposing of any trash: this includes the pavilion, rest rooms, pool grounds and snack bar area.

At the discretion of the pool staff, members and guests who engage in behavior that is deemed to be offensive, dangerous or disruptive may be asked to leave the pool.

Our normal hours of operation are 12:00 pm to 8:00 pm.

Special hours may be posted due to holidays, home swim meets, and inclement weather.

We appreciate your cooperation with the pool rules. Our goal is to make the pool as safe and well maintained as possible. If you see a situation that is unsafe, or have any questions, see a lifeguard, the pool manager, or a member of the pool board.
