# Director's Report: Mr. Doyle

- We are looking to host a marching contest which brings in significant funds. Our program already knows how to do this as we host our UIL Marching Contest each year. We were hoping to begin this year, however that may not be possible as the Waco BOA is on the date we were looking at. We intend to go to Waco again this coming year.
- I will be traveling to San Antonio with Langston who made All State Band in 6A!
- March 27 and 28 is the UIL Concert and Sight Reading Contest.
- Our Pre-UIL concert is March 7th.
- We have been experimenting with Presto (the current school communication tool) with the idea that it may replace Booster Hub. It could pose a problem with 8th grade students as they aren't in Presto yet.

- The Main Event fundraiser made over \$420.00. This was the first fundraiser CTRR has held at Main Event. It was very successful even though the event was held on a Tuesday night which typically has fewer customers. We have contacted the Main Event staff and will try to have another fundraiser this year. We will also try to hold it on a Sunday night when Main Event is typically busier. This fundraiser doesn't require our families to purchase anything (although it is fun to participate with other band families), we only need to talk to customers as they enter and exit Main Event to ask for their receipt. We receive 20% of their bill.
- We are beginning our mulch sale to benefit percussion. This is very successful for Boswell. People that purchase mulch will pick up their order on a designated day. The students are not delivering it. Orders will be due Feb 28 and distribution will be March 8. We make around \$6.00 per bag. We will want to make this fundraiser a yearly event.

# **Existing Business**

- Band banquet will be Saturday, May 3, 2025 at National Hall.
  - We will be using a different DJ this year and he has a photo booth.
  - Since we are saving money on the DJ and photo booth, we will have a Boba Bar.
  - o Tickets will be \$25.00 each person and will go on sale April 7. The person that sold the most tamales (Alex Wright) will get a free ticket. Funds for the banquet will pay for Band director tickets.
  - Research for food/caterer options is ongoing. When the list of options has been narrowed down, we will survey the Seniors for the final decision.
  - Since the banquet is on a Saturday this year, volunteers will be able to decorate the hall for a few hours in the morning.
- Our booster club/directors have been considering changing from Booster Hub to
  Presto. Presto is the current communication method used by the school. Julie has
  been researching Presto. It is not certain that Presto could be used for band
  registration. Kristy Swaim has experience with Jot Forms and will look into that
  as a possible solution for a registration form. Jot Forms has the ability to total
  fees and include a link to make payments. The goal is to have it ready to go in
  April for registration.

- The Booster Club is in need of a treasurer for next year. Please talk to people that you know for someone who could possibly fill this role. We may look at a third party to do all the payments, payroll, W9s etc. In this case, the treasurer would have the responsibility of communication, oversight of payments and be a contact between the third party and our organization.
