Reading of Minutes

Director's Report: Mr. Doyle

- We have just concluded the longest marching season this school has ever had. This was due to our football team advancing to playoffs for the first time. Dr. McCowan received a complimentary letter, from someone not associated with our school, recognizing our band and the way we cheered and supported our team.
- Parents/volunteers, thank you for everything you did to support our band (food, transporting equipment, washing uniforms many times).
- It's December and there are alot of events on the calendar for the next two weeks.
- The Saginaw Christmas Parade starts fairly quickly after dark usually around 6. The parade route is a straight route from Willow Creek Elementary school to the Saginaw Recreation Center. This is a change from last year, but this route has been used previously.
- We are hosting multiple holiday concerts this coming week in CTHS PAC. Marine Creek Middle School is Monday 12/9, our Jazz Band is Tuesday 12/10, Ed Willkie Middle School is Wednesday 12/11 and our Wind Ensemble, Symphonic and Concert Bands is Thursday 12/12.
- Per Ms. Rivers, the Brass All Region Audition is tomorrow. If you are a room monitor, there is a meeting in the library at 5:45. The room monitor job is not a difficult task. The main responsibility is to keep the room running on time and announce the each player.
- Our band has again been asked to participate in Ranger Magic by providing hot cocoa for CTHS teachers on the last day of school before the winter break. We provide the cocoa packets and cups (not the hot water).
- As soon as the marching season ended, we began planning next year's marching show. We are using a new coordinator who is experienced but also limits the number of clients

he takes so he isn't quite as busy as the coordinator we have used in the past. Designing and writing a show is a big job. The cost is \$10,000.00. To hire the coordinator, we need to pay \$2,000.00 now, \$1,000.00 two times in the spring and the remaining balance will be due next school year. Our budget includes funds for this expense; however, the budget for next school year isn't approved until February 2025.

 - Vote passed unanimously
- Propose the band collect nonperishable food items at our holiday concert to donate to Community Link. We will place boxes in the PAC lobby. Britney will collect boxes and wrap them to look festive. I will reach out to Community Link to find a list of needed items.
- Per Julie, as a fundraiser at the holiday concert last year, we sold hot cocoa and Christmas
 Tree cakes and Anthony dressed as an Elf announcing shout outs. After floor discussion,
 we will provide hot cocoa and Christmas Tree cakes for free to those who bring a donated
 item. Those who do not donate to Community Link will be able to purchase these
 snacks.
- In an effort to be more visible to middle school band families, some of the Boosters would like to attend the middle school band concerts. Concerts begin at 6:30. Make a QR code available so people attending the concert can register for our March to the Beat Fun Run.
- Thank you to Veronica for changing out all the uniform shirts and hip drops to purple for our last performances.
