

MUJAAY GANMA FOUNDATION OBJECTIVES



1. NAME

The name of the corporation is: Mujaay Ganma Foundation Aboriginal Corporation.

2. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the corporation are to engage the wider community in assisting people with cancer and their families, in particular, Aboriginal people, to reduce the impact of cancer through informing and assisting people, where possible, to overcome Cancer and manage treatments with comfort and ease. In general, to help Aboriginal community members live a healthy lifestyle and where possible support young people to grow up mentally and physically healthy with positive sporting opportunities.

The corporation aims to:

- To help Aboriginal people with cancer to access the support they need so that their lack of transport, money and the feelings of helplessness are alleviated through having good advice and the financial support. This can then enable them to have what they need, when staying away from home, in order to be treated.
- To educate people in communities about the issues facing people with cancer. Also to talk to family members who are looking to support someone to overcome cancer or at least to minimise the impact of cancer.
- To partner with other organisations with similar aims in the wider community to better meet the cultural needs of Aboriginal people living with and working to overcome cancer.
- To help with research to overcome cancer.
- To help create healthy communities through supporting lifestyle changes and cancer prevention strategies. To help Aboriginal children to live a healthy lifestyle by supporting educational and sports opportunities where healthy approaches to life can facilitate growing up in good mental, emotional and physical health. In particular supporting Aboriginal kids to learn in a safe supportive environment at school and beyond and to learn to play cricket, netball and football while growing up in their communities. To operate and maintain a gift fund to be known as 'The Mujaay Ganma Foundation Aboriginal Corporation Gift Fund' in accordance with the requirements of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
