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Trophies

Overall Show Winner-Awarded to the person who accumulates most points in all categories throughout the Show.

(In the case of more than one person accumulating the same number of points, the number of first place points, second place points etc. will be used to decide the winner. Applies to all section winners.)

Ian Kirkman Memorial Shield—Awarded to the person accumulating the most points in Vegetables and Fruit - section A

Mick Bearcroft Memorial Cup—Awarded for the most points in Flowers—Section B

Hampton Best Garden Trophy -Hampton residents only

Best Mini Garden-Under 16 section

Angela Arthur under 16's Challenge Cup—awarded for most points accumulated across all categories

Avla's Legacy Sunflower Trophy—awarded to Best stAndrews CE First School section winner

Ged Bearcroft, Men Only Challenge Cup—awarded to the winner of Men only section

Angela Amy Photography Challenge Cup—Awarded for most points awarded in photography section. In the case of a draw a judges decision will be final.

Ann Evans Trophy—awarded to best in show—Floral Art

Jane Cook Award - awarded to best in show - Art

Trophies are awarded at the end of Show day, and if taken home, remain the responsibility of the winner until returned to show secretary two months prior to show day the following year.

The winner may have their name engraved on the trophy in the appropriate place according to naming convention.

Set Recipe - Fruit Cake - F8

1 hour 45 minutes but check after 1 hour

Ingredients	preheat oven to 150° C, gas mark 3
400g Mixed fruit	You will also need a 2Lb loaf tin—prepared
125g room temperature Butter	
3 large eggs	Method
60ml Milk	1. Put all the ingredients except fruit into a bowl and beat
1 rounded tablespoon of Jam	well—but not too much.
125g soft brown sugar	2. stir in the dried fruit
250g self raising flour	3 . cook for around 1 hour 45 minutes but check after 1 ho 30minutes. Remove when cooked.

2 teaspoons mixed spice

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Men Only Recipe—Chocolate and Rum Cake—F11

Ingredients for cake—225g Butter softened, 300g caster sugar, 4 medium eggs - separated, 175g self raising flour, 25g cocoa powder, 50g ground almonds, 175g good quality dark chocolate melted

Ingredients for filling – 500ml double cream, 300g good quality dark chocolate chopped, 2tblsp dark Rum

Pre heat oven to 180°C (350°F, Gas mark 4)

- 1. cream softened butter with half the sugar until pale and light. Gradually beat in the egg yolks and fold in the flour, cocoa powder and almonds, alternating with the melted chocolate.
- 2. Whisk the egg whites until stiff and then fold in the remaining sugar. Gently fold this mixture into the cake mixture and pour into the tin—a suitably [prepared 23cm (9inch) round spring form tin.
- 3. Bake for around 1 hour and 10 minutes, until well risen and springy to touch. Leave to cool in tin for five minutes then turn onto wire rake to cool.
- 4. To make filling and icing, heat cream until boiling, remove pan from heat and whisk in the chocolate and rum until mixture is smooth and glossy. Leave to cool until mixture has thickened.
- 5. Cut the cake into three layers horizontally and use some of the chocolate mixture to sandwich the cake back together. Spread the rest of the icing on the top and sides of the cake.

Show Rules

Multiple entries are welcome in each section, but only one entry per Class.

All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor with the exception of Floral Art. All other sections must be the exhibitors own work including photography.

The judges reserve the right to visit exhibitors garden before or after the Show to inspect any produce entered into the Show. The judges decision is final.

All exhibits to be brought to the Main Marquee between 8.30 am and 10.30 on show day. Cars will be allowed brief access to the field in order to unload exhibits, but parking on the field is not permitted.

Exhibitors will be given a class card for each exhibit, which should be placed name side down until judging is complete. Any signature /identification marks should not be visible on any exhibit.

All photographs should be displayed on a rigid A4 mount - No frames or folders. A photograph can be only be entered into one class. No photograph previously entered can be entered in subsequent years. The exhibitor may be asked for proof that they have taken the photograph.

Points are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each Class. Points accumulate to count towards relevant trophies in individual Sections. Points awarded in all Sections accumulate towards overall Show Winner Trophy.

Marquee will be cleared at 10.30 to allow judging to begin at 10.45. The Show Marquee will open to the public at 1pm. Entry to marquee is charged for all adults, including exhibitors. Minimum £1 entry fee but further contributions are very welcome.

Cups will be presented at 4.30pm. Please do not remove exhibits until presentations have been made.

Any exhibits not cleared away by 5.45pm will be disposed of, unless arrangements have been made in advance with Show Secretary. Leftover produce will be donated to Wallace House Open Larder/Food Bank.

Winners of trophies are responsible for safekeeping and must return them to the Show Secretary two months prior to the next show.

D2. An Arrangement of flowers created without florist foam. A table top arrangement, no larger than 60cm wide and high.

D3. <u>Arrangement in a cream jug</u>. An arrangement of flowers displayed in a cream jug that would be suitable to decorate an Afternoon Tea Tray. Maximum height 20cm including jug and flowers.

D4. <u>Imagination</u>. The Chance to abandon formal constraint and let your imagination run wild. You will have 60cm of table top space to provide a display which could include any amount of flowers/foliage/accessories, but does not have to have all of those elements. Please give your display a name.



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
