
Wall of Recognition

Design Inspiration (Internet)

Jim Yerkes sketched out the project on paper; calculating/measuring not only the individual pieces, but determining the best way to apply support strips (spanning two windows) for maximum support. Then the back board was cut, stained and sanded, providing a faux wall for Jim to build upon.

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Project pieces were set down on the floor to finalize layout and spacing. Various items were laid on top to see what size frames needed to be purchased.



Building the framework to support the weight.



Installing the back boards.









Installing the decorative boards using spacers and bubble level.

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Painter's tape was put down before the nail gun was used. Then a stain was daubed on top of the nail heads. When dried, this was lightly sanded and the tape was removed. The process made it difficult to pinpoint the nail markings.
