

2025 Highlights

- The upper level of the pavilion has been replanted on both sides with great success
- Worked closely with the city of Dallas Police department and social services to address the continuing challenges of homeless individuals in the park
- Continuing involvement in Lake Cliff/Founders Park Visioning Committee

2025 Plans

- Maintenance and upkeep of existing planting
- Restoration of the “pineapple” fountain (really a rosebud)
- Installation of educational signage in two locations

Kidd Springs

2025 Highlights

- Prepped meditation garden beds and began planting shade perennials
- Expanded beds near the lake were planted with pink muhly grass and dwarf yaupon hollies
- Dallas County Road and Bridge installed 2nd second reproduction lantern donated by the Crow Museum
- Missing shrubs were replaced in several areas throughout the Japanese garden.
- Work began on rainwater mitigation project at the big hill near the south entrance to the Japanese garden.

2026 Plans

- Design and install perennials in the bed with the new reproduction Japanese lantern & near the wooden boardwalk.
- Continue work on rainwater mitigation project.

2025 Highlights

- Two large L-shaped beds were planted with 20 different native plants (168 plugs in total)
- Worked with the City of Dallas Parks & Recreation team to remove several dead magnolia trees

2026 Plans

- Re-plant at least two of the upper beds to add more layers and groundcover where there currently is only hibiscus and mulch.
- Work with the City to improve water & irrigation management in the park, incl installation of overfill tank so we no longer lose 20K gallons of water daily

2024 Highlights

- Prairie restoration by removal of invasive plants
- We had numerous nature walks, including wildflower walks, bug walks, tree ID walks, foraging walks, birding walks and walks with pooches
