Nature and Wildlife

Hampden Park

Our latest trip to Hampden Park was brilliant fun and we were joined by David who has since retired from his previous position as a full time hive worker. The aim of the trip was to identify the different animal species found at the park as part of an ongoing survey we are doing. Kitted out with warm clothes, binoculars, bird seed, a clipboard and a British wildlife guide we began our Wednesday morning trip around the lake.



Patrick and Debbie have recently joined the wildlife group and it's been great having them. Patrick can be seen on the left giving some bird seed to his new collection of feathered friends.



While walking around the lake, a small family of brown rats provided us with some great photo opportunities. They took an interest in some bird food, which gave us plenty of time to take pictures.

At the start of the lakeside walk we saw a large variety of bird species. These included crows, herring gulls, black headed gulls, mallard ducks, coot, moorhen, heron and feral pigeons. As well as birds, we spotted many grey squirrels foraging across the park. As we continued we spotted call ducks, wood pigeon, jackdaws, brown rats and even an unusual duck which we are yet to identify. In total we saw 14 different animal species!









Half way round the lake we were feeding some pigeons when a huge flock descended from the trees and landed on us. These friendly birds were amazing to see up close and we all (especially Patrick) had a brilliant time holding and feeding them. It's always an amazing experience getting up close to wild animals and these beautiful white pigeons were no exception.

Princes Park

Last Wednesday, the group headed out to Princes Park, a site located just down the road from The Hive. In the past, visits to Princes park have been a bit uneventful. This was not the case on Wednesday when we turned up to find huge amounts of birds on and around the lake. The numbers only grew when we began feeding them some bird seed, kindly provided by Cathy earlier that day.





Debbie yet again managed to attract a wild pigeon that came and sat on her hand to have a feed. Unlike the pigeons at Hampden park, the ones at Princes Park are not used to being fed by hand, which made Debbie's achievement all the more impressive. Some of the other bird species present at the site included herring gulls, black headed gulls, moorhens, mute swan and even a little egret!







Along with the pigeons, a huge number of swans turned up, with some of them coming out the water to investigate us. Bravely, Patrick and Debbie both had a go feeding the swans by hand, which was a brilliant experience for them. The swans appeared very pleased to receive an early lunch.





David got some amazing wildlife photos during our time at the lake. One of my favourites is his photo of a little egret, a small heron species that is an uncommon sight at Princes Park. Check out those yellow feet!
