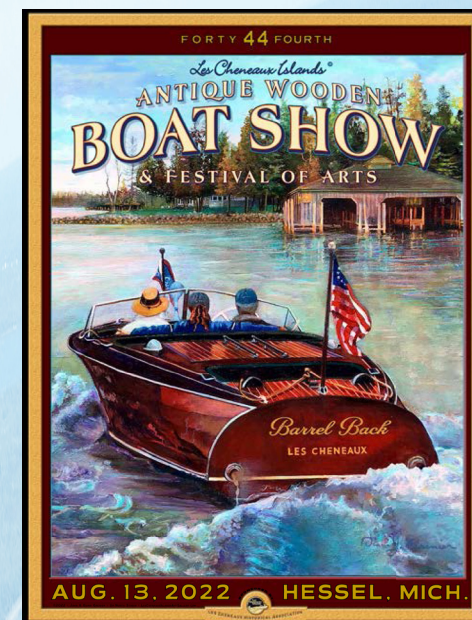

The Boat Show



The Les Cheneaux Islands Antique Wooden Boat Show, held each year in Hessel, Michigan, has been a major attraction since it began in 1978. The show averages 150 entries each year and is one of the largest shows featuring antique and classic wooden boats.

Some of the country's finest boats call the beautiful Les Cheneaux Islands home. Many of these boats are used daily during the summer months as a primary mode of transportation to and from the cottages dotting our area's 36 sheltered islands. Les Cheneaux has a rich heritage in boat building and repair. Our craftsmen continue to offer some of the finest restoration and repair services available.

Entries in the boat show arrive each August from as far as California and Florida and include dinghies, rowboats, canoes, launches, sailboats, utilities, runabouts, large cruisers, racers and classic non-wood.

Festival of Arts

Held in conjunction with the Antique wooden Boat Show is the Festival of Arts. Artists display and sell a variety of artwork, including photographs, paintings, pottery, stained glass, textiles and jewelry. Around 65 of the Midwest's finest artists participate in this juried show.

Barrel-Backs



A Barrel-Back is a boat with the transom and aft deck shaped in a half circle. John Hacker was the first to use this design in a 33 ft. runabout built for Henry Ford in 1924.

In the mid 1930's the Port Carling Boat Co. in Ontario used this design in some of their Seabirds.

The Barrel-Back design came to be known as "Streamlining" and was used by both Gar Wood and Chris-Craft in the late 1930's; and in 1941 Century Sea Maids were designed with a rounded transom.

Chris-Craft started using the Barrel Stern design with their 16 ft Special RaceBoat in 1937. They eventually used it on 17, 19, 23, and very few 27 ft runabouts from 1937 through 1942. Chris-Craft built a total of 1054 runabouts using this design. In 1942 most U.S. motorboat builders converted to 100% war production.

After WW II ended the design was considered too expensive to build. There currently is one boat builder, Fish Bros. Marine Service, of Queensbury, NY, that builds Chris-Craft replicas.
