Inside, we've begun playing games like "Have You Ever," which encouraged us to share our experiences and learn more about each other in a lighthearted, inclusive way. Alongside these activities, we've started focusing on our Full Value concepts, laying the foundation for a respectful and supportive classroom environment where everyone feels valued and heard.

STEM: Miss Amy

In STEM, we had a great August finishing up our Space Unit. We did an experiment to make Moon Rocks. We created Space Puzzles for our peers to put together. They created amazing Space Puzzles! We have been practicing procedures and expectations in the STEM room. We have been trying to use TInkercad to create keychains with our 3D Printer. We will continue to problem solve to see if we can get the program to work.

In the afternoon, students created with Legos, Engineering Design Kits, Gecko Kits, and Ozobots. They were able to design and create on Osmos too.

Community Learning Group: Miss Morgan

In August, students wrapped up our Growth Mindset unit, reflecting on how they can persevere, learn from mistakes, and set goals for themselves. We are now shifting into the 7 Habits of Happy Kids, starting with learning the difference between being proactive versus reactive in their choices and actions. Over the next six weeks, students will explore the remaining habits: Begin with the End in Mind, Put First Things First, Think Win-Win, Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood, Synergize, and Sharpen the Saw. We are learning these habits to build a strong foundation for positive attitudes and behaviors in school, afterschool programs, and at home, helping students make thoughtful choices in their day-to-day lives.
