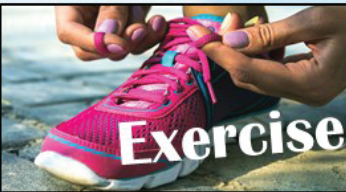

The solemnness of Ash Wednesday exceeds even that of Good Friday. Good Friday is focused on redemption coming from the death and subsequent resurrection of Christ. (This is why it is Good Friday.) Ash Wednesday is primarily a time for each individual to confront the unpleasant reality of that all must die. It is for this reason that you will often hear the words of the prophet Joel proclaimed on Ash Wednesday:

Joel 2.1 Blow a horn in Zion, Sound an alarm on My holy mount! Let all dwellers on earth tremble, For the day of the LORD has come! It is close— 2 A day of darkness and gloom, A day of densest cloud Spread like soot over the hills. A vast, enormous horde— Nothing like it has ever happened, And it shall never happen again Through the years and ages.

Joel 2.12 “Yet even now”—says the LORD— “Turn back to Me with all your hearts, And with fasting, weeping, and lamenting.”

The central point of the Ash Wednesday ritual is found in the words spoken at the imposition of the ashes: Remember, O mortal, that you are dust; and to dust you shall return. (Genesis 3.19) It is the deliberate confrontation with the reality of death that separates the church from the world. The world seeks to avoid the reality of death at all costs, while the church is unafraid at the concept of our pending demise. For it is in facing death that we are able to fully consider the meaning of both life and death. For believers this consideration of death is not arbitrary. The fact that the ashes, which represent the reality of the effect of sin in the form of death, is placed on our heads in the sign of the cross reminds us that it is the cross of Calvary that allows us to understand both life, and our death, in a way the world will never understand. Yes, we will die. Yes, it is unavoidable. But we choose to die in Christ, whose death transforms ours. And we live now, not in fear of death, but in the joy of our walk in Christ. For it is Christ that has conquered death.

But if we truly live in Christ, then our lives must reflect this new reality that gives hope to our existence. As such, Ash Wednesday, as the first day of Lent, marks an extended period of self reflection, repentance, and sacrifice.

Let us with repentant hearts come before of God of love and forgiveness!
