 3c. If you later found the item, did it forever modify your care and safety of that item?
- 3d. Have you ever been the lost sheep as mentioned in this passage?

Read Luke 15:8-10. 4. How many coins did the woman have? 4b. What are the three steps she uses to locate he coin?

- 4c. Why do you think the woman called for her neighbors?
- 5. Focus in on chapter 15 verses 11-31 highlighting the words spoken by the father to his sons.
- 5b. What did the first son ask his father to do in verse 12?
- 5c. What did the younger son do with his inheritance?
- 5d. What happened to the younger son in the foreign land/ country?
- 6. What does it mean to "COME TO YOURSELF"?
- 6b.(Personal and optional) Will you share a time where you "came to yourself" and describe the episode?

- 7. What was the speech the younger son rehearsed before returning home?
- 7b. Do you believe it was sincere or was he just hungry?
- 8. How did the father receive his son?
- 8b. Have you ever received a loved one or friend as described in Luke 15:20?
