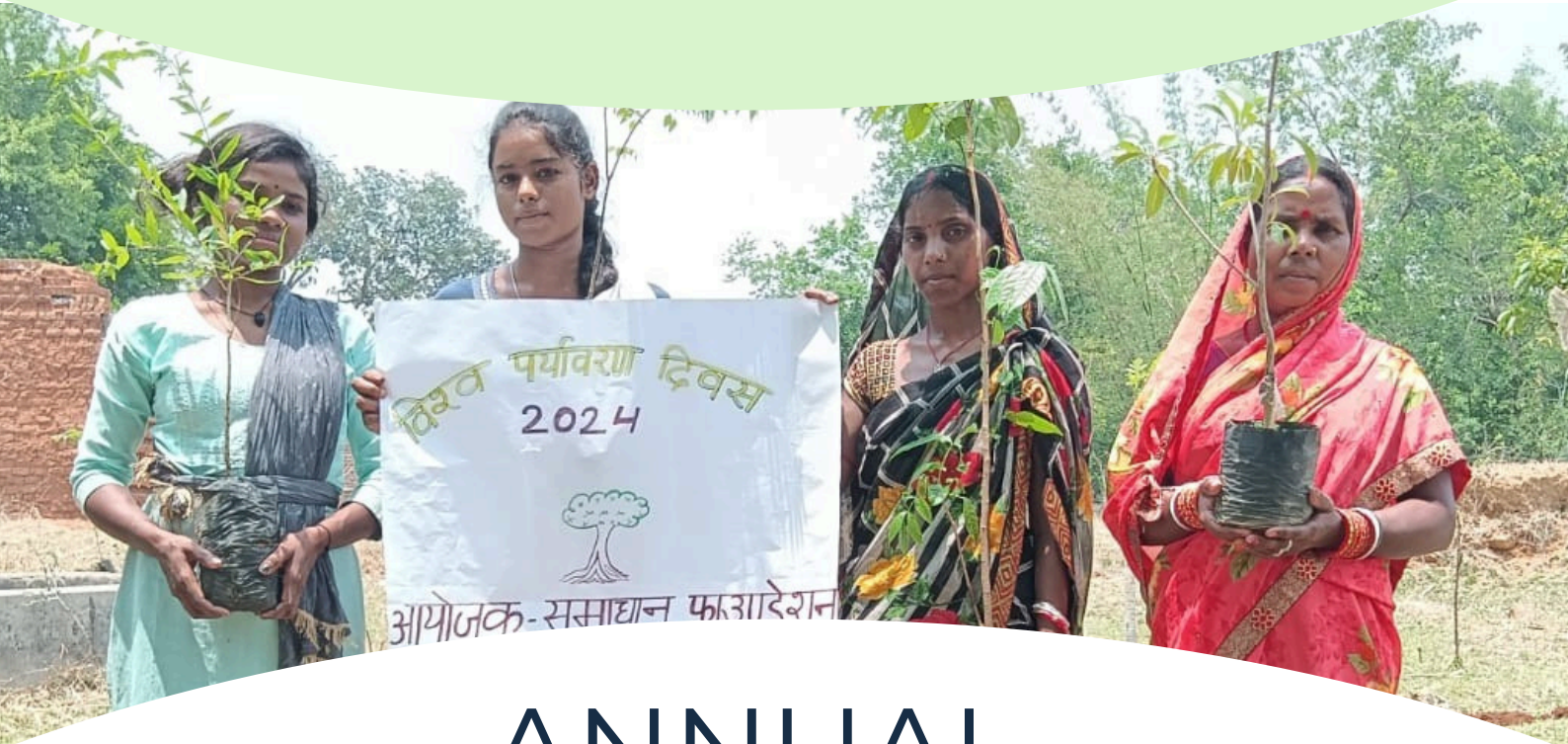

Highlights of the Year 2024–25



- ✓ 120 women farmers trained in traditional and organic farming
- ✓ Millets cultivated after 20+ years in Jamtara
- ✓ 1 Jaivik Utpad Kendra operationalized and managed by women
- ✓ 90 adolescent girls trained in enterprise skills in Munger
- ✓ Over 500 children engaged in educational and enrollment activities
- ✓ Eye screening camps conducted in Giridih & Deoghar
- ✓ Summer relief camp at Jasidih Station served over 10,000 travelers
- ✓ Recognition of women farmers at state and local levels



1. Enterprise Development on Traditional and Sustainable Farming

Support Provided By: NABARD.

Location: 6 Villages, Narayanpur Block, Jamtara
District, Jharkhand

Target Group: 120 Women Farmers

Key Activities:

10-day Intensive Training:

Sixty women farmers were selected and trained on traditional and natural farming techniques, including organic manure preparation, pest control using local inputs, mixed cropping, and millet cultivation.

2-day Refresher Training (4 Batches):

A total of 120 farmers participated in refresher training sessions to revisit techniques, address field challenges, and encourage peer learning through practical demonstrations and group discussions.

Establishment of Jaivik Utpad Kendra:

A women-led Organic Input Production Center was set up in Purnanagar village, producing and supplying compost, bio-pesticides, and organic growth enhancers to local farmers.

Kisan Credit Card (KCC) Camp:

KCC enrollment camps were organized at the village level to link women farmers with formal credit services through banks, enabling them to finance their farming inputs without relying on informal loans.

Bank and Government Liaison:

The team actively collaborated with banks and agriculture/horticulture departments to facilitate convergence with government schemes, financial inclusion, and technical support.

Achievements:

- 120 women gained awareness and knowledge on sustainable farming.
- 80% of trained women adopted Napier grass as a regular fodder crop.
- Millets were reintroduced and cultivated in the region after 20 years.
- The Jaivik Utpad Kendra is now fully functional and run by trained women, promoting self-reliance and entrepreneurship.



2. Women Empowerment Initiatives

Objective: Strengthening leadership, recognition, and participation of women in rural development.

Key Activities:

Women Convention Organized:

A day-long women's gathering brought together 50–60 women farmers to share experiences, celebrate achievements, and engage in dialogue with stakeholders.

Felicitation of Best Farmers:

Two women were honored with the Best Farmer Award during the convention for their exceptional performance in organic farming and community mobilization.

Recognition of Khiriya Devi:

Special mention was given to Khiriya Devi, a leading woman farmer who received the Best LEDP Farmer Award from NABARD at a state-level event in Ranchi, presented by the Hon'ble Agriculture Minister of Jharkhand.



3. Education Initiatives

Objective: To promote quality learning, school enrollment, and holistic development among children, especially from marginalized backgrounds.

Key Activities:

A. Deoghar District – School-based Interventions

- Activities were conducted in 5 rural schools, engaging students through:
 - Quiz competitions to enhance general knowledge and academic interest.
 - Painting competitions to foster creativity and expression.
 - Sports competitions to promote fitness, teamwork, and active participation.

B. Pakur District – PVTG Adolescent and Children Outreach

- Celebration of National Girl Child Day:
- A special program was organized for PVTG adolescent girls in Littipara block, including games, competitions, and motivational sessions on education and rights.
- School Enrollment Campaign:
 - A focused campaign was carried out in 6 villages, encouraging tribal families to enroll their children in school.
- Distribution of Educational Kits:
 - Essential items like notebooks, pencils, erasers, and other stationery were distributed to PVTG children to reduce entry barriers and motivate regular attendance.



4. Adolescent Entrepreneur Program

Objective: To empower adolescent girls with vocational skills and entrepreneurial mindsets.

Supported By: Foundation to Educate Girls Globally under the ITC Supported Unnati Program

Training Areas Covered:

- **Food Processing:** Girls were trained in making pickles, jams, chutneys, and spice mixes using locally available materials.
- **Agarbatti (Incense Stick) Making:** Training focused on production, packaging, and marketing of incense sticks as a viable micro-enterprise.

Soft Toy Making: Girls learned the basic techniques of soft toy design, cutting, stitching, and finishing for commercial production.

Outcome:

The training helped adolescent girls explore alternative income-generating avenues and inspired confidence for starting home-based enterprises.

Location: Munger, Bihar

Participants: 90 Adolescent Girls



5. Relief Work During Summer Season

Objective: To provide drinking water relief to commuters during peak summer heat.

Location: Jasidih Railway Station, Deoghar

Supported By: Leuze Electronic Pvt. Ltd.

Duration: 1 Months

Key Actions:

Installed soil water pots (matkas) at multiple points in the station.

Deployed one dedicated community volunteer to manage the pots and serve water to travelers.

Ensured daily replenishment and cleanliness of water pots.

Outcome:

Thousands of travelers benefitted from the free water distribution. The initiative was praised by railway authorities and the public.



6. Health Awareness Program – Eye Camps

Location: Deoghar and Giridih Districts

Objective: To promote early detection and treatment of visual impairments.

Support Provided By: Leuze Electronic Pvt. Ltd.

Key Activities:

Organized community-based eye screening camps in rural areas.

Provided free check-ups, diagnosis, and guidance on eye health.

Identified patients for cataract surgeries and referred them to government facilities under the DBCS program.

Outcome:

Improved access to vision care for remote populations and increased awareness on the importance of regular eye checkups.



Success Story: Khiriya Devi –

A Beacon of Sustainable Farming



Khiriya Devi, a woman farmer from Jamtara district, emerged as an inspiring figure through her commitment to traditional and sustainable agriculture. With support from the Samadhan Foundation under the NABARD-LEDP initiative, she adopted organic practices, cultivated millets after two decades, and championed the use of Napier grass as fodder. Her leadership and innovation earned her the prestigious Best Farmer Award, presented by the Agriculture Minister of Jharkhand during a state-level convention in Ranchi. Today, she leads other women in running the Jaivik Utpad Kendra in Purnanagar, setting a powerful example of women-led enterprise and rural transformation.

Lukhi Devi – Rising Through Resilience



After losing her husband, Lukhi Devi of Kumargadia village took charge of her farm and family. With support from Samadhan Foundation, she shifted to organic farming, availed a ₹60,000 SHG loan, and started growing vegetables using bio-inputs. Her income increased by 15%, and she now sells directly in local markets. Lukhi Devi is now a role model, inspiring other women to adopt sustainable agriculture.



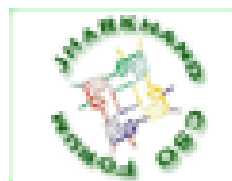
