In an interview in 1986, Gale talked about his years at The Outlook and the beginning of Gresham's building boom. "It was a gung-ho time," he said, of covering stories about the widening of Powell Boulevard, the creation of Main City Park and building the downtown parking lots.

Gale remarked about his work. "An editor has to be sensitive to the public, but thick-skinned enough to

take it."

Prominent artist, falconer dies at 61

Byron J. Gardner, a prominent Northwest artist, professor emeritus of art at Portland State University and a master falconer, died of cancer May 14 in an Oregon City care center. He was 61.

A memorial service will be at 2 p.m. June 7 in the Cabell Center at Catlin Gabel School.

Born June 5, 1930, in Portland, he

was a graduate of Gresh-High am School and the Portland Art Museum School. Mr. Gardner was primarily a landscape artist and his paintings are on display in a number of

Northwest museums, as well as in private collections.

At the time of his death, he was professor emeritus of art at PSU. Mr. Gardner taught art at Catlin Gabel School for 13 years and had been an artist member of the board for the Portland Art Museum. He also had been a board member of the High Desert Museum in Bend and the Boys and Girls Aid Society.

Mr. Gardner became intrigued with falconry after reading about it during his boyhood. He became seriously involved in falconry in 1958 and had a large role in promoting its respectability in an era when many falcons were either being shot or decimated by the effects of DDT.

In 1977, he helped form the Oregon Falconers Association and had served as president of the organization. He also had been a director for the North American Falconers Association and designed the organization's logo.

During an interview with a writer for The Oregonian in 1991, Mr. Gardner said the advent of lightweight radio transmitters in recent vears helped to solve what has historically been the bane of the falconer — tracking the whereabouts of the often capricious birds.

"If you don't get to a falcon soon after it takes a bird down, it will eat its prey and go off on its own," he said. "Falcons aren't like puppy dogs. They're wild creatures and they don't need you. They can be sweet and even friendly, but they can still set their sights on the distant horizon and go."

Mr. Gardner also was a past president of the West Hills Unitarian Fellowship Church.

Survivors include his wife, Judith Ann; daughter, Elizabeth Woods of La Center, Wash.; stepdaughters, Angela Sorensen of Oregon City and Lela Edmiston of Milwaukie; and five grandchildren.

Disposition was by cremation.

None of us became great hockey players, but we sure had fun!


Dad was transferred again in 1973, this time to Portland, Oregon. He and Ursula thought they had been sent to the boonies and decided immediately they would only stay for 6 months. They spent the weekends of those months camping, backpacking, and skiing and realized that Oregon and the Pacific Northwest was a spectacular place to live and to raise their kids, and they never moved again.

He learned Spanish and traveled to Central and South America. His Spanish with a German and English accent probably was difficult to understand, but his skill and dedication were appreciated nonetheless. In Oregon, he claimed strangers often said he reminded them of someone, and

after a little pause, they identified the "someone" as Arnold Schwarzenegger. English with Austrian accent. I never really believed the story until a few years ago. He said a few words of greeting to a stranger. She stopped, looked at him, and said he reminded her of.... Dad cringed and I laughed! It was true! Arnold.

Ten years ago, while hiking and visiting with friends and family in Switzerland and Austria, he was diagnosed with heart failure. He came home to have surgery and needed a revision 6 weeks later. He flew through the second surgery and recovered well. We were told his new valves would last about 10 years. He made great use of those years! They were filled with skiing, hiking, and relaxing at the coast, with a Full-Sail Amber Ale beside him in the sun. He loved good food and the monthly family lunches at Justa Pasta. He treasured his extra time with his neighbors, his friends at The Austrian-Club, and his aging colleagues from work. Most of all, he loved being with his family.

A wonderful Dad, husband, and grandfather died peacefully at home in his sleep on June 18, 2020 with Ursula by his side. He is missed by Ursula; his kids Hans, Caroline, Steve, and Peter; his sons-and-daughters-in-law Scot, Amanda, and Kenan; and his grandkids Fin, Max, Reed, Alex, Oliver, Kari and Maia. We think of him often. May everyone enjoy life, friends and family as much as he did.


Robert Patrick Gabriel


In 1944, Gerald moved to his permanent home on a farm near Sandy. In 1957 he began his career at the Sandy Elementary School District where he worked for 32 years.


