Dev lopment offers upscale h

On a clear day, you can see the snow caps of the surrounding Cascade mountains.

Standing on the 12th tee, Brian Lessler points toward Mount St. Helens, Mount Adams and Mount Hood. Down below him stretches what will soon be a championship 18-hole golf course, the vivid green grass complementing the stark blue sky and puffs of white clouds.

"When people see this thing, they fall in love," said Lessler, project manager for the new Persimmon Country Club Community. "I knew a year ago I wanted to live here. It just took that long to convince my wife and family to move from Lake Oswego to Gresham."

Lessler admits blue-collar Gresham is probably the last place to find an upscale, \$23 million 175-acre country club.

"The world told us we were crazy to build an upscale golf course in Gresham, east Multnomah County," Lessler said. "You've got a big perception to overcome.

"In order to overcome that, we had to do something nobody can ignore," Lessler added. "If you're going to fly in the face of convention, you've got to do it with gusto."

One of the driving forces behind the golf course and surrounding housing developments is Japanese businessman Hiroshi Morihara, who took over the project after the previous owners ran into financial trouble.

"I think he always had a vision of doing a golf course properly and saw the area and the beauty of it and was captured by it," Lessler said.

Since buying the area, Morihara has poured millions into the project, expanding the golf course and ensuring the highest quality in all phases of development.

The developers created their own real estate company to sell home sites and founded another construction company to assist four other reputable builders in the actual construction of the homes.

But the center piece of the development remained the championship golf

course

"This is really the only residential neighborhood country club designed around a PGA 18-hole golf course," Lessler said. "There isn't another one.

"Hiroshi's philosophy ... was the quality of the golf course has taken the priority," Lessler continued. "We sort of remodeled and reshaped the thing."

Award-winning course designer Gene "Bunny" Mason developed the expanded golf course, placing fairways horizontally along the sloping hillsides. The design makes for a relatively level and easy-walking golf course.

Developers also enlisted the help of PGA golf pro Bob Gilder to evaluate

the new course. Gilder said the course would be a fun challenge to play, Lessler said.

The center of the country club will be a two-story, 19,000-square-foot club house with a commanding view of the golf course and valley.

Unlike most country clubs, designers placed the housing development away from the course itself. Nestled in the tree-lined hill above the course, the houses are still within walking distance of the course but far enough away to protect the homes from hooks and slices.

"So we aren't bouncing golf balls off of people's houses," Lessler said. Lessler said developers are taking

ogreat care to retain the natural beauty of the area despite the construction of 33 homes in the first phase of the housing development. The housing development includes a 75-acre tree preserve.

"When those homes are done it'll look like they've been there 15 years," Lessler said. "The landscaping will be done. It's got to be done perfectly. We had to let the property speak for itself."

Despite the home site price tag ranging from \$69,000 to \$200,000, the beauty of the area has already prompted much interest. Over 70 percent of the home sites in the first phase of the housing development are already reserved, Lessler said.

Membership fees total \$175 per month with a minimum \$12,500 initiation fee. Lessler said the club will accept 250 members, but will also open up the course for public play at certain tee-off times.

Despite poor winter weather and constant spring rains, Lessler said the course and clubhouse should be completed by August. By mid-summer, die-hard golfers will soon be able to enjoy the championship course and spectacular view.

"That's a real signature hole," Lessler said, looking down the fairway of the 12th hole. "Mount Hood is right behind the flag pin." When people see this thing, they fall in love. Persimmon will throw a 1940s-style party in January to celebrate the opening of its 7,000-square-foot banquet center.

But you'd better hurry.

A Persimmon official said they will accept the last few available registrations Monday.

Those who want to attend the Jan. 25 bash to benefit seven area foundations and the Gresham Historical Society must reply to Persimmon, specifically Jane Ouzts at 667-7500.

"We would love to see hundreds of people," said Mary McSwain, Persimmon marketing manager.

The country club community is putting on the event to benefit charity and boost awareness of its new, \$2 million banquet center, which can handle a 300-person dinner or a 600-guest, theater-style event.

"These are the people that we hope will frequent the place," McSwain said about those sent invitations, "They are the people that we see organizing events."

But the event, which costs \$25 a person or \$50 a person for patron tickets that include a special gift and a keepsake mug, is open to everyone and is designed to raise money for community groups.

The beneficiaries will be Mt. Hood Community College Foundation, the Mount Hood Medical Center Foundation, the Gresham Chamber Foundation, the Mt. Hood Festival of Jazz Foundation, the Centennial School District Foundation, the Gresham/Barlow School District Foundation, the Reynolds School District Foundation and the Gresham Historical Society.

Each group will sponsor a '40s-style activity booth, which could include 1940s "Jeopardy!" and karaoke and a booth where people can pose in period clothing for photographs.

Groups should stick to the decade in ques-

tion, McSwain said.

"There won't be any sumo wrestling, for example," she said. Those booths, though, will give the foundations' representatives an opportunity to network and share information about their causes.

McSwain said Persimmon members, especially Sue O'Halloran of Kohler Meyers O'Halloran Realtors, wanted to have the fund-raising party.

"Persimmon has some very communityminded members," McSwain said. "Persimmon is in a position where we are not totally private, and we feel we are members of the community. We support several organizations in a big way."

In this case, the support will come with a big band.

Persimmon Country Club strives for exclusivity

The course of golf in Gresham is undergoing a change as Persimmon Country Club begins the transition from a semi-private to exclusive facility.

Facing little competition in the private club market, the Japanese-owned Persimmon is hoping to attract members interested in exclusivity.

Nestled in the hills of southwest Gresham with sweeping views of Mt. Hood, Mt. St. Helens and Mt. Adams, the club has been a semi-private operation since the original nine-hole golf course opened in the mid-1990s.

Correctly guessing the direction surrounding neighborhoods would take with upscale homes, Persimmon's owners knew they'd hit a hole in one with the location.

"The concern, I believe, with the owners of the property was that Persimmon was ahead of its time," said Mike Biscotti, club general manager. "It was semi-private to make ends meet, but to continue to make it viable in this community, it was in the best interest to take it private. That's always been our long-range goal."

Expansion in recent years has included a full-service clubhouse, tennis and swim center, driving range and banquet facilities, not to mention a championship 18-hole golf course.

With a membership campaign underway, Biscotti said the aim is to reach those who haven't previously considered country club membership.

"We're hoping that the announcement that we're going private will excite some people," Biscotti said. "There are those out there who have hesitated to join because they enjoy that exclusivity of a private club. There's a concern among them that if you join a coun-

try club that has public access, there's the potential for it to go completely public. They worry about the value of their investment."

Biscotti is confident that Persimmon's challenging 18-hole course will speak for itself to potential members.

"There's a lot of variety (on the course)," he said. "Each hole is different. That's why I like to call it a 'member's course' — it's constantly changing."

As duffers think ahead for spring play on the links, the announcement of Persimmon's decision isn't raising any flags of concern among other area golf courses.

Quite the contrary.

"(Persimmon going private) should affect us a lot," said Scott Shields, head golf professional at Gresham Golf Course on Northeast Division Street. "We've definitely going to see a lot more business,

especially since we're the only course in the downtown area with Hound Hollow gone."

Hound Hollow, a nine-hole executive course in Wood Village, closed in April to make way for the Wood Village Town Center adjacent to Multnomah Greyhound Park.

Shields said that talk of Persimmon closing the club to public use has been in the wind for a long time in golfing circles. The expense of green fees at Persimmon — \$45 on weekdays and \$55 on weekends for 18 holes and a cart — has always been a deterrent for the average golfer to play the course frequently.

"Persimmon hasn't hurt us to this point," Shields said. "We just keep going up as it is. But if (Persimmon) does go private, we'll see more play, definitely. I just don't think it'll happen any time

While Persimmon goes through

membership alterations, Biscotti said there are no plans to change any of the club's other operations.

"Even though we've made the decision to go private, we want the public to know we're still open to the public," he said. "We will continue to honor commitments currently scheduled. We won't leave anybody out in the cold."

Offering a variety of membership plans, Biscotti said the goal is to cap membership at 400 golfers. Currently, there are 217 full golf members who enjoy priority tee times and unlimited golf. Once certain levels of membership are satisfied, public access will be reduced.

Memberships are classed as nontransferable or transferable and cost \$10,000 and \$15,000, respectively. Monthly dues, Biscotti said, aren't a set fee.

Junior memberships are offered to golfers under age 35 for \$5,000.

Restaur nt opens at P rsimmon

For chef David Wynter, being asked to head up the staff at Knickers, Persimmon Country Club's restaurant, was a homecoming of sorts.

Wynter, who graduated from Barlow High School, received his training at the Culinary Institute of America in New York. He went on to work at the Multnomah Athletic Club and Lakeside Gardens, where he primarily catered weddings.

Persimmon staff approached Wynter when he was catering an invitation party for future members at the

"They hired me and said 'do it,' " he said, smiling.

He started Oct. 4 with the major appliances and fixtures and has hired a staff of three, created the menu and found suppliers.

Knickers Grill, at 500 S.E. Butler Road, opened Thursday serving Outlack, 10/20102

breakfast and lunch from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m., every day but Monday.

It's been a little slow so far, but Wynter suspects most people don't know he's open, with construction and landscaping still in progress on other parts of the club.

The dining room looks out onto the golf course and Mount Hood. Birch paneling lines the walls and the chairs are covered with a tapestry of golfers.

"There's an excellent view of the mountain and a nice warm atmosphere," he said.

The menu features standards like pancakes and omelets for breakfast. Lunch includes soups, sandwiches and salads, with the most expensive item being a Caesar Halibut Salad at \$7.25.

A Gresham company, Pastries by Iris, provides his pies, but Wynter makes everything else from scratch. He expects to take advantage of local harvests, such as berries, he said.

"We've got a nice selection of beer

and wine to choose from - Oregon and California wines, imported and domestic beers," he added.

Eventually, the restaurant will serve dinner one night a week, but management has not determined when that will be or which night, he said. Meals will probably be in the \$15 to \$20 range.

"It's going to be upscale fine dining. I hadn't really planned a menu yet - salmon, steaks," he said.

Knickers is open to the public but also serves the members-only lounge upstairs and offer members catering services, he said.

As start-up concerns die down, Wynter said that diners can look for daily specials such as chicken Cantonese salad, beer batter fish and chips, lasagna and a variety of sand-



MEMBERSHIP CLASSIFICATIONS

Membership at Persimmon Country Club is offered in the following categories:

Full Privilege Membership

Full Privilege Corporate Membership

Associate Full Privilege Membership

The combined total of these categories shall not exceed 250 memberships.

FULL PRIVILEGE MEMBERSHIP

Full Privilege Membership is reserved for personal or corporate individuals who wish full, permanent privileges at Persimmon Country Club. A total of 250 Full Privilege Memberships will be offered. One hundred-fifty memberships will be offered solely to property owners in the Persimmon Country Club Community.

An additional 100 Full Memberships are reserved for non-property owners, which will be offered to any individual or corporation, subject to approval.

Full Members are entitled to use of all Club facilities. A seven-day advanced tee time reservation privilege is also included. Club privileges are extended not only to the member but to the member's spouse, as well as children under the age of 22 who are living at home or enrolled in school. Upon resignation, a Full Privilege Member will receive 80% of the original initiation fee paid to Persimmon Country Club.

FULL PRIVILEGE CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP

Full Privilege Corporate Membership is identical to Full Privilege Membership in terms of privileges & dues. Full Privilege Corporate Memberships are available to those who do not own property at Persimmon Country Club Community, and are available as a permanent status to those who enroll during



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the offering of the first 100 memberships. Full Privilege Corporate Membership is the property of a corporation or firm, and can be assigned to a designated individual. Only one designated individual is permitted per membership. The corporation or firm which owns the membership may change the designated individual from time to time, following the approval of the new individual, and with payment of the applicable transfer fee. No additional initiation fee is required for subsequent designees, provided the membership is maintained on a current basis.

Upon resignation, a corporation holding a Full Privilege Membership will receive 80% of the original initiation fee paid to Persimmon Country Club.

ASSOCIATE FULL PRIVILEGE MEMBERSHIP

Associate Full Privilege Memberships are offered to those individuals who do not own property at Persimmon Country Club Community, after a complement of 100 permanent non-property memberships are subscribed.

Associate Full Privilege members have the same privileges as Full Privilege Members, however, this membership is not permanent and may be recalled at the option of Persimmon Country Club. By giving the Associate Full Privilege member six months' notice, the Club may recall the membership and refund the Associate Member 100% of the paid initiation fee. Associate Full Privilege Members would be recalled only to open the roster for a Persimmon Country Club Community property owner.

ADDITIONAL MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS

Full and Associate Sports Memberships, Swim and Tennis Memberships, and Clubhouse Memberships will become available starting in 1994.

- Q:Who owns Persimmon Country Club?
- Q: What are the facilities offered at Persimmon Country Club Community?
- Q: What amenities will be offered in the Clubhouse?

- A: Persimmon is owned by CGC, Inc., an Oregon Corporation. CGC is a sister company of Columbia Glen Development Company which owns and operates 570 apartments in Vancouver, Washington.
- A: Persimmon Country Club will offer an 18-hole championship golf course with a putting green and golf practice facility. Additionally, there will be a Clubhouse of approximately 19,000 sq. ft.
- A: The Clubhouse will consist of two levels. The lower level will be open to non-members while the upper level is reserved for members only. The members level will consist of luxurious Men's and Women's locker rooms complete with saunas and lounge areas. The Fitness Center will be located in the member's area along with the Video Training Room. A Private Living Room will be reserved for the members and their guests, where they may enjoy conversation, food and beverage. The lower level of the Club will house the Pro Shop and the Grille Room. It will have a shower/change area for non-member usage.



- Q: How many golfers will be enrolled in the Club?
- A: Persimmon Country Club will enroll 250 members in the Club. They will also allow selected non-member play. However, members have the privilege of advanced tee time reservations and the sole use of the Member's level at the Clubhouse.
- Q: What type of memberships will be offered in the Club?
- A: The Club will initially offer three classifications of membership: Full Membership, Associate Membership and Corporate Membership.

Full Membership in Persimmon Country Club is limited to the first 150 property owners in the Persimmon Country Club Community and the first 100 non-property owners who enroll in the Club. Full Members will not pay green fees, or practice range fees. They will be required to pay for cart fees and locker rental fees. Full Members have a 7-day advance tee time privilege.

Associate Membership in Persimmon Country Club will have identical facility privileges as Full Members. An Associate Membership is defined as a non-permanent membership offered to non-property owners. Associate Members may be enrolled after the 100 permanent Full Memberships, reserved for non-property owners, are enrolled and before the compliment of 250 members is reached.

The Club has the right to recall Associate Members on a first-in, last-out basis. If recall is issued, the Associate Member receives back 100 percent of the initiation fee originally paid.

Corporate Memberships have the same privileges as Full or Associate Memberships and are placed in the name of the corporation, firm, or partnership. The membership is assigned to one designee and his or her family upon the approval of the designee by the Club. Corporate Memberships have a "change of designee" option in which the designee may be changed from time to time with the approval of the Club and payment of the transfer fee.

- Q: Does my family have Club privileges?
- A: Membership entitles the member and his or her immediate family to use the Club Facilities in accordance with the membership classification.

 A member's immediate family shall include the member's spouse and their unmarried children under the age of 22 who live with the member or are enrolled full time in an accredited educational institution.
- Q: If I leave the Club will I be entitled to a refund?
- A: Yes, members who resign from the Club will receive 80% of their original initiation deposit paid to the Club. If an Associate Member is recalled, the member receives 100% of the initiation deposit paid.
- Q: Why do you call it an initiation deposit instead of an initiation fee?
- A: The tax structure of the Club requires that we refund 100% of the initiation deposit paid by the member, thirty years from his or her acceptance date. The 30 year refund will be given only to those members who have not received the 80% refund prior to being a member for thirty years.

- Q:Do property owners have special rights as members?
- A: Property Owners are offered permanent membership in the Club. Only if the original property owner enrolls as a permanent member in the Club, can subsequent property owners of that home be entitled to a membership reservation. The property owner is given 60 days to activate his or her membership reservation.
- Q:If I have further questions concerning the Club who do I contact?
- A: Brenda Hall, the Club's Director of Membership, will be happy to assist you in answering questions concerning the development of the Persimmon Country Club Community.
- Q:Why was the Club named, Persimmon?
- A: Persimmon is sought throughout the world as the wood of choice for top quality golf clubs. These clubs are carefully crafted by various manufacturers, using over 100 hand operations per club.

 Many professionals agree that only Persimmon allows them to "feel" the ball, helping to improve their consistency and swing. In the world of golf, persimmon is associated with quality, durability and beauty. The same holds true for the Persimmon community.
