
I am very sorry that I don't have your name & address. It is two weeks since I arrived back here from the most exhausting trip.

However, I do remember the encounter with you at the Pioneer Cemetery. It's truly a coincidence, but I never forget your kindness to bring the book, Gresham ... a friendly city to Mr. Ando's home.

I've read it twice & remember you with deepest appreciation.

These two years I've been trying to find the root of Mrs. Miyo Iwakoshi, first ^{Japanese} settler in Gresham from Japan. The grave I visited that time was of Andrew McKinnon, a Scot, who brought Miyo with him in 1880. He died in 1886.

1880 was still in the early period of Gresham, and I was interested in the time after & before 1880.
