Nicolas Alexander, known to most as Nick, was born as Mikolaj Woronowicz on July 6, 1926, in Ziemianie, Dizna, Poland.

Nick died Oct. 28, 2013, in Happy Valley, one day after his 62nd wedding anniversary to his loving wife and soulmate, Pauline, and one day before the 60th anniversary of his emigration to America.

Nick Alexander pursued and embraced the American dream. Born to landed aristocracy in Eastern Poland, Nick's life changed when the Nazis occupied Poland in 1939. As a runner

for the Polish underground, Nick was caught by the Germans in 1944 and sent to Dachau concentration camp, where he was imprisoned for 18 months. 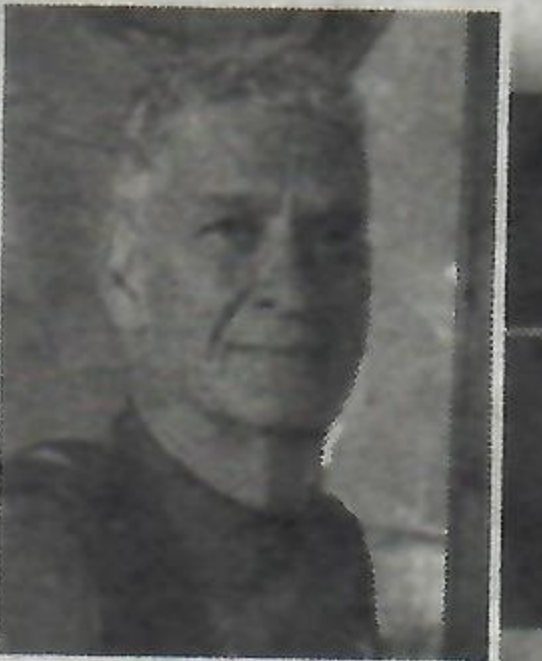

After the war ended, Andy and Marvel settled in Los Angeles and, being good Catholics, started producing children. In 1959 with five kids and counting, they moved onto ten acres in Pleasant Valley where they topped off with two more children. All seven children attended Centennial High School.

Andy was an engineer with General Telephone Company in Gresham until he retired in 1984. He was always active: Fast pitch softball, golf, horseshoes, and bowling. He coached baseball; he played the accordion, piano, and harmonica; he was a Boy Scout leader and served as the Pleasant Valley School Board Chair. Even as he grew old, he never really grew up. After he retired he enjoyed working on the property, traveling with Marvel, and chilling with his phone company pals. In 2017, after 72 years of marriage, Marvel passed away, and he never really got over that. He was also preceded in death by his brother, Ray.

The rest of us live on including Dad's best friend Betty Stowell, all seven kids: Bob (Kathryn), Rick (Lynne), Jim (Barb), Jean (Tom), Mike (Claudia), Jack (Michelle), and Kathy; plus a bunch of grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Andy had a shirt some time ago that read: "Old Marines never die; they just go to Hell and regroup". We're hoping for better.
