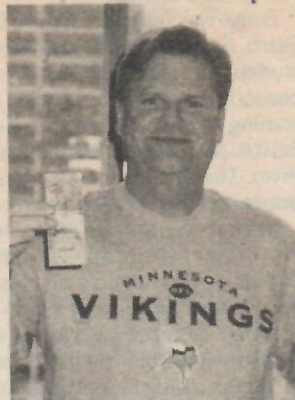

Following the war, Jim and his family moved back to Troutdale and faced the struggles of Japanese families returning home. Jim was always grateful for the leadership of several members of the Troutdale Gresham community who helped ease those tensions and welcomed them back.

When he came of age at the end of the war, Jim joined the U.S. Army and served in Germany. After his service, Jim returned to Troutdale, attended Oregon State University and eventually began independently farming. He married Susie "Jinx" Tamiyasu, the daughter of a prominent Portland Japanese family. Jinx's mother the owner of New Tokyo restaurant and father a leader in the Portland Japanese community and Buddhist church.

A lifetime of early mornings, hard work and grit revealed Jim as a dynamic businessman and highly successful berry farmer. Lifelong Troutdale resident James "Jim" Mamoru Fujii died Tuesday, Dec. 3. He was 87.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 14, at Oregon Buddhist Temple, 3720 S.E. 34th Ave., Portland.

Jim was born May 28, 1926, into a large Japanese immigrant farming family in Troutdale. His father, Bukichi "Ben," came to Troutdale from Japan in 1905, followed by his mother, Yoshino (Yamakado).

The Fujii kids attended

Troutdale Elementary and worked on the farm before World War II. While most West Coast Japanese American citizens were interned, Jim's father moved the family to a farm labor tent camp in Nyssa, Ore., where they lived for the duration of the war.

This allowed the family to work and the boys to attend Nyssa High, where Jim played third base on a state championship baseball team. Following the war, Jim and his family moved back to Troutdale and faced the struggles of Japanese American families returning home.

Jim was always grateful for the leadership of several members of the Troutdale and Gresham community who helped ease those tensions and welcomed them back.

In Sharon Nesbit's "Centennial History of Troutdale," Jim remembered Larry Ayls-

ing his hand.

"He did it in front of God and everybody. I've never forgotten that," he said.

When he came of age at the end of the war, Jim joined the U.S. Army and served in Germany. After his service, Jim returned to Troutdale, attended Oregon State University and eventually began independently farming. He married Susie "Jinx" Tamiyasu, the daughter of a prominent Portland Japanese American family.

Jim was a dynamic businessman whose farm was named

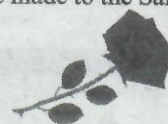

Rev. Harold Fuller brought comfort through faith, baking

Fuller passed away
Sunday, April 14

For nearly three decades, retired Rev. Harold Fuller was known for providing physical and spiritual comfort at Gresham's Legacy Mount Hood Medical Center through his delicious, hand-made pies.

The longtime Gresham resident and retired minister was beloved within the community, and among his friends and neighbors alike. He was supportive of local businesses, a common sight at charity events and was always quick with a smile.

Fuller passed away unexpectedly on Sunday, April 14.

Born on August 10, 1931, in Palestine, Illinois, Fuller grew up in a household full of children. He attended Eastern Illinois University to complete his undergraduate studies, which is where he met his future wife, Elizabeth "Beth" Fuller. The couple would go on to celebrate almost 60 years of marriage, before Beth passed away in 2012 a few days shy of their anniversary.

After two years of seminary school in his home state, Fuller moved to Portland to complete his final year. Faith was an important part of his life, which was dedicated to serving God and helping others. He would often introduce himself as a "Roving Pastor," because he would be wherever he was needed.

The family lived in Sandy in the early 1960s before settling in Gresham in 1984.

Fuller pastored at three churches between 1956 to 1979, before transitioning into chaplaincy at Legacy Mount Hood. He spent 29 years at the hospital, providing comfort and, of course, his legendary pies.

He baked at least once a week for fellow staff members, who happily traded him fruit for a homemade pie. He loved surprising people on their birthdays with tasty treats, and would also give pies to families awaiting news in the intensive care unit, which was on the same floor as his office.

"I always take a pie to holiday dinners," Fuller told Outlook staff during the newspaper's annual holiday baking contest a few years ago. "I can't get in the door if I don't have one in my hands."

Fuller was happy to have won that contest in 2017. He said he would use the prize money to buy more fruit and give away more pies. The trick to Fuller's delicious pies was his secret crust recipe, which came from his mother. His crust recipe wasn't really secret because he was happy to share it with anyone who asked.

Fuller was also an active member with the Gresham Area Chamber of Commerce, where he served as an ambassador, a group of chamber members who help people feel welcome and comfortable at various events. The month before he passed away, he was the emcee for the Chamber's meetings, which made for a fun time for all. Fuller had a strong sense of humor, and loved to laugh.

Chamber CEO Lynn Snodgrass met Fuller when she served on the Mount Hood Medical Center Foundation. Their friendship lasted for decades.

"He had purpose in whatever he was doing — he was a constant," Snodgrass said. "He was one of those people you would gravitate toward."

Fuller is survived by his daughters, Kimberly and Caryn, sister Donna, brothers Kenneth, Robert and Leon, four grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

A service for Fuller will be held at 11 a.m. Friday, April 26, at Grace Community Church, 800 S.E. Hogan Road. A reception will follow the service.

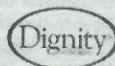

their best friends. Through his travels he also gained a deep appreciation for old European castles, church and museum architecture.

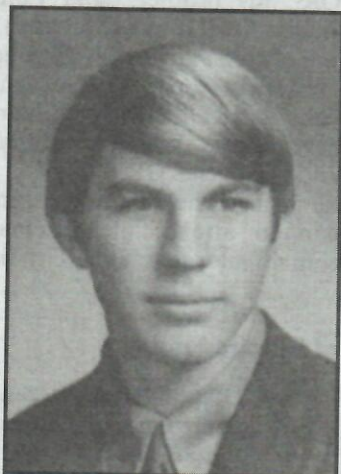
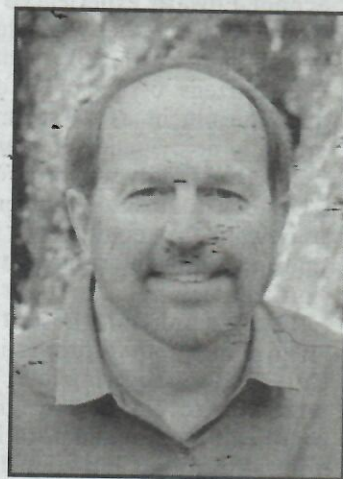

Edward Harumi Fujii

April 1, 1923 to May 22, 2021

Edward Harumi Fujii, a former resident of Troutdale, Gresham, and Portland died on May 22, after a short illness at age 98.

Edward was born into a large, emigrated Japanese family in Troutdale on April 1, 1923, the son of Bukichi and Yoshino Fujii. The family, eventually 6 boys and 2 girls, purchased a 79 acre farm that became a well known local fixture selling produce at the Portland Farmers Market and various berry crops to the public and to Gresham Berry Growers. The farm continued to expand from that initial 79 acre parcel.

Edward attended Troutdale Grade School and graduated from Gresham High School, as did all of his siblings.

Events following the Pearl Harbor attack on December 7th, 1942 and the second World War would largely define the family's fortunes, in common with all Japanese Americans in the Pacific Coast states. Initially, after the attack, as a senior in Gresham High School Edward experienced no hostility whatsoever. However, his father was classified as an alien, and in common with all pacific coast residents and U.S. citizens of Japanese descent, faced relocation and internment as a "security measure" in spite of virtually no evidence of espionage or threat. On May 7, 1942 the family was ordered to report to the Pacific Livestock Exposition Center in North Portland with only what they could carry in suitcases for indefinite and uncertain internment under the official guise of "protection".

Facing community hostility, most families had to sell their homes and all properties under short notice and duress, at a staggering loss. The Fujii family, however were able to recruit a neighboring family, Charlotte and Scott Cunningham, to live in the house and take over all farming activities. Ironically, Edwards oldest brother had been drafted in 1941 and was already serving the US in the military.

The Fujii family chose, rather than live incarcerated in internment camps, to relocate to Nyssa, Oregon where they were allowed to live and work as critical farm laborers. Military recruitment had severely reduced the farm labor force. The family initially lived in tents and worked hard and were eventually relocated to former army barracks of the inactive CCC camp at Adrian. Together with other Portland area families, Edward pursued his wife-to-be, Aya Iwasaki, from the large Iwasaki family farm business in Hillsboro, OR.

The irony of those years was that the entire Japanese "farm labor" contingent in Nyssa had only to cross

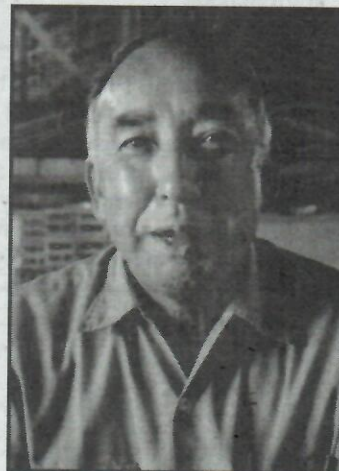
the Snake River into Idaho to be free of all restrictions. During 1943 Edward was able to attend Brigham Young University for two terms until, with a reversal of policy, Japanese Americans were again drafted to serve on the European front. Edward served and yet did not need to go overseas as the war ended.

The family returned to their farm in the Troutdale area and expanded their holdings, eventually taken over by his brothers. Edward stepped back from farming and became a wholesale produce broker, under the name of Ed Fujii Produce, selling to large grocery chains. Edward retired in 1990 and sold the business which still operates under his original name.

Edward married Aya Iwasaki on July 9th 1950 and raised three children; Scott, Becki, and Tami. He served as an announcer for Judo competitions involving Obukan Judo. He was an avid bowler and later in life discovered a love of golf. He and Aya often traveled to play golf with friends and he enjoyed the family's annual vacations to Hawaii and Black Butte Ranch in Oregon. After 43 years in the large family house in Gresham, Edward and Aya moved to a house in Summerplace, and eventually to Russellville Senior Living Community. We are grateful for the care he received there.

Edward is preceded in death by four half siblings from his father's initial marriage in Japan until his first wife's death, and by his full siblings Akye, Kazuo, Kimi, Jack, Jim, and Tadato. 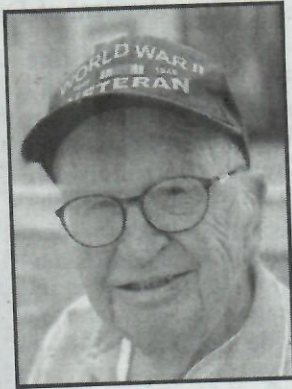
