According to Mary Mallett, the first store in Gresham was built by Samuel Metzger on the old Camp Ground sit at Northwest Powell and Main streets. Ben Rollins, Samuel's step-son is generally credited with haveing an early store. The Outlook (2/28/36) quotes Viola Forsyth as saying the store was at the corner of South Roberts and Powell about 1884.

William Johnson, son of Boone and Hannah Johnson, (according to Mallett) built the first two-story building (a hotel) on the southwest corner of Powell and Main in 1880. Then he bought Ben Rollins' stock "which was located across Powell St." He later added the small bakery "to the east."

Soon after that, apparently Johnson sold the hotel building to Dan-Metzger. After that Mr. Metzger operated a food mill which stood between Johnson's store and a balcksmith's shop, which was run by a C. C. Miller. The hop was not far from the Baptist church, which was neartthe school building.

By the time the town had a name in 1884, it was still only a four building village, according to Mary Mallett.

In the 1880's, however, Gresham, although still rough, was beginning to resemble a town. People who had built residences along Roberts avenue and its cross streets, the street was named after an early pioneer, were beginning to want some of the amenties of a city, particularly some attention to be paid to the streets and to have some street-lights.

There were a number of two-story buildings and in 1903 the first bank was established in Gresham in a on-story building at the corner of Powell and Main streets with a capitalization of \$15,000. Archie was the president of the bank, Theordore Brugger was vice-president, with Carl Lundquist as cashier. A few years later, in 1910 a rival bank began which was called the Bank of Gresham. It was located in the Dowsett-Patanuade building, a block east of the frist bank. It did not have as strong a capitalization as its competitor. James Elkington was the first president, John Sleret was vice-president with Emil Kardell as the first cashier. Both banks were forced to close in 1932, during the Depression. The Bank of Gresham was combined withe First State Bank in an effort to keep them open. Later in the year, however, it had to close, anyway. Liquidation was not complete for 6 years and the State Banking Examiner did not close his books until Dec. 24, 1938.

The businessmen of Gresham were very dissatisfied to have no local bank and overtures were made to Portland's First National bank to start a branch in Gresham, which it finally did opening on April 1, 1924. Several years after that the Gresham State Bank started up. It was charted by the state on Sept. 8, 1949.

The year before Gresham became incorporated saw the P. R.L. & P opening a trolley line. This was in December, 1902, and it provided transportation from Portland to Gresham, but with only limited service. The branch line was later built from Linneman Junction with depot on the north side of Gresham, that was known at the Mt. Hood depot. The line went north from the Junction, crossed Section Line road, made a shart right turn and then east into Gresham.

In 1905 Gresham was incorporated with Lewis Shattuck as first mayor. Shattuck had been the proprietor of a grocery store but had sold out to John Bartelt in 1903. Shattuck had had the business for 22 years and had a thriving trade of \$15,000 a month. Lewis was the son of John Wesley Shattuck and a cousin of Mrs. Jake Metzger. Bartelt did not have the store long as head a fire which destroyed the building. He later sold the rescued stock to B. L. Walrad, who in 1912 srted his store in a building on the west side of Main St. He later moved to the north end of the Ely bu lding, built in 1919.(?\*

By this time (1905) Gresham was a stone of 700. The First State Bank building had had another story added to it, which accomodated several docotrs in its upper story. The Bank of Gresham building had offices in its second story for a doctor and several dentists, although it as originally built for a hote, with many rooms for rent.

At the time of incorpation there were several two-story buildings with the following stores in them:

Guiss and Sons - clothing, fabrics and shoes Shattuck, Howitt and Short - groceries and meats Dan Metzger - planning mill Carlson and Emery - furniture and undertaking

A free library had even benn established --a bankch of the Multnomak County system--about a year before with Miss Lida Culy as librarian. It was located in t e east obd if the John Metzger building.

In the 1905 Outlook, there were several pictures of recently completed buildings of the up-coming Lewis and Clark Exposition. Obviously a publicity campaign was being mounted to publicize the Fair.

Auto dealers in thos early days included the following:

C. M. Zimmerson selling and servicing Overlands
C. I. Raker, who had recently moved to the Latourell
building from Troutdale. He was selling and servicing
Fords. He was in business with his son Ellsworth.
Ed. Osborn, with his bright red hair brightening the
scene, was selling Chevrolets.
Southard and Palmouist were doing business in the
Gresham Garage. This was a building built for Dr.
Slgtrf Thomadon, s truitef

Alfred Thompson, a retired Methodist Minister. Palmouist was soon to leave the car business and turn to making leather goods, possibly even buggy whips.

Latourell and Sons were advertising the "New Maxwell" (Shades of Jack Benny)

J. C. Hessell was still advertising farm implements as well as wagons, carts and buggies.

By 1916 a thriving town had evolved and the following merchants were listed:

This ice plant is really the first of its kind to be established in Gresham although there had been a number of smaller plants earlier. G.O. 5-24-1921 1921 The Zweibel Manufacturing company, which has for the past few months been making plans to locate here, has purchased a  $5\frac{1}{2}$  acre tract from O.A. Eastman. The property is located north of the Bull run car tracks and opposite the plant of the Beaver State Motor company. This is the first wood-working plant of any size to enter the northwest. The nearest plant making parts needed by woolen mills G.O. 8-23-1921 are in the New England states. 1922 Gresham's newest industry is a tire factory. Gotlieb Fudicker has installed an auto tire machine at his place on South Roberts avenue and has made several fabric tires, but yesterday he produced a perfect cord tire 30 x 3 1/2, named the "Gresham" and having a "G" tread, making a perfect non-skid tread. This was claimed to be the first cord tire made on the Pacific coast, at any rate by this G.O. 11-21-1922 process.



## Many of the Businesses in Gresham Have Continued During 25 Years

Dowsett and Howitt Date Back Farthest; Otts as Dentists, Columbia Brick Works,
Osburn and Dahl Here Long.

(By Chase E. St. Slair)

Between 20 and 25 of the business enterprises listed in the directory of business and professional men in the first issue of the Gresham Outlook 25 years ago are still serving the people of this community.

Several firms are being conducted today under the same management as 25 years ago. Nearly 20 of them have undergone several changes of proprietorship. All of them have been consistent users of advertising space in the columns of the Gresham Outlook.

### Gresham Drug Company Oldest

The concern with probably the most years of business behind it under the same head is the Gresham Drug Co. The store had been in existence for several years prior to the fall of 1902 when Arthur Dowsett purchased the business from Mrs. Ione McColl, postmaster.

from Mrs. Ione McColl, postmaster. In 1906 Mr. Dowsett was joined by Joseph A. Pateneaude. This partnership lasted for almost a quarter of a century, until Mr. Pateneaude's death in 1930, when Mr. Dowsett's son, Stafford, acquired the Pateneaude interest. After more than a third of a century Mr. Dowsett still takes an active part in the conduct of the store.

### Howitt Started in 1899

T. R. Howitt established his first meat market in Gresham in 1899 and while he was in business here earlier than any of the other firms to be mentioned in this article his ownership of a retail business here has not been continuous. Howitt's market has been in several different locations. In 1911 when the Gresham Outlook was started the market was in a frame building that stood near the site of A. J. W. Brown's

In 17 16 Mr. Heatt leased his market to Brown, who had formerly been employed there, and for the next ten years devoted his attention to the wholesale meat business in Portland.

Returning here about 1926 he purchased the grocery store owned by Cecil Metzger and in 1929 moved into his own building on the corner of Main avenue and First street.

### Watkins Man Old-Timer

C. H. Lane, the Watkins man, another long-time business men of Gresham, undertook the selling of his line here in August, 1906. At that time he resided in a house on the corner of North Roberts avenue and Second street, on the site of the present T. R. Howitt residence.

In January, 1907, he left Gresham for about three years and made his home on the Base Line road near the Twelve Mile corners, or at Terry, as that location was known when the Outlook started. Returning to Gresham about 1910 he made his home at Cleveland avenue and Division street for several months, moving to his property on Cleveland avenue in 1911.

Since 1926 he had lived on Vic-

Since 1926 he had lived on Victoria avenue, in Eastman's addition

### Only Pioneer Professional Men

Dr. H. H. Ott came to Gresham in 1906 and began the practice of dental medicine in an office over the postoffice, part of the upstairs location later occupied by the Outlook Publishing company.

In 1908 he was joined by his brother, Dr. W. J., and the two Otts had their offices in the Howitt building, which at that time was well-peopled with professional men.

well-peopled with professional men. During the year 1916 the two doctors established separate offices, Dr. Harry occupying rooms in the building where Welling's restaurant is located. Dr. Will moved to a suite in the Gresham Investment company building, which he still occupies. Dr. Harry has returned to rooms in the Howitt building.

### Brick Manufactory Grows

The Columbia Brick works was established in 1905 by A. Klose and Franz Olbrich. The plant is located at Hogan station, but the company has a large sales office in Portland. Olbrich did not take an active part in the plant until June, 1906.

The Hogan plant has grown from a small, steam-driven yard, making relatively a few hundred thousand brick a year to one of the largest and best equipped plants in the state, shipping much of its product by truck and rail. Early in its development machinery for the manufacture of hollow building tile was added and the most modern methods are used in the making of brick, hollow tile and drain tile.

Many of Gresham's brick buildings and some of the finest structures in Portland are constructed of clay products burned in the local

Shoe Repair Business Expands

Carl Dahl, proprietor of the Gresham Shoe Shop, came here in 1910 and purchased the shoe repair business of Gust Larson, harness maker and shoe repairer.

The Gresham Shoe shop opened for business in a small building on East Powell street. As the business grew Dahl added up-to-date machine equipment and now has one of the best equipped shoe shops in the state in a city this size

During the nearly 26 years of business here Mr. Dahl's shop has occupied space in the same block, although he has moved a few times.

### Will Celebrate Quarter Century

Twenty-five years ago one of Gresham's leading grocery stores was conducted by Dan W. Metzger in the old wooden building adjoining the east end of the A. J. W. Brown building.

Early in April, 1911, A. W. and

Early in April, 1911, A. W. and Will Metzger bought out their uncle Dan, and the business became known as Metzger Bros. In February, 1916 the name was changed to A. W. Metzger and the store was known by that title until 1919 when it became A. W. Metzger & Co.

The fine building occupied by the store was built in 1916. A. W. Metzger & Co. will celebrate a quarter century of service in April

The beginnings of the telephone exchange, now a part of the expansive West Coast Telephone company system, were laid in 1906 when Timothy Brownhill, editor of the Multnomah Record, interested other local business men in the formation of the Multnomah & Clackamas County Mutual Telephone company.

Following three other major changes in ownership the West Coast company acquired the local telephone plant in 1928. In 1929 work of rebuilding the outdoor and indoor plant was completed and the greater part of the local telephone system was cut over to automatic service.
