### Hicks doors to close for last time

## 66-year-old store a victim of the times

After 66 years of selling baby shoes, blue jeans and underwear to Gresham residents, the W.R. Hicks Co. department store is closing its doors

and selling out to the walls.

Today is the last day of regular operation for the venerable store, a landmark in downtown Gresham since 1923. Owners Bob and Jim Bergeron, who are turning their attention to developing the second of their Pacific Crest stores, will close the doors and spend the next three days preparing for the going out of business sale that begins at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday.

"It is a good-bad feeling," Bob Bergeron, 45, said Friday as he gazed out on the department store's sales floor from his second floor office. The Bergeron brothers are sad that W.R. Hicks' "time has come." Independent department stores such as theirs are not the trend in merchandising and marketing for the 1990s. On the other hand, their upscale Pacific Crest store, which features Northwest-style clothing, is flourishing in the market niche reserved for specialty goods. The brothers have been invited to open a second store in Sunriver near Bend on Memorial Day weekend.

While the Bergerons scurry to stock the Sunriver store, they must sell the contents of the Hicks store, including furnishings. They anticipate closing in late April. And they must say goodbye to 18 full- and part-time employees.

"There have been lot of teary times around here," Bob Bergeron said, sprawling in a pink, gray and chrome chair that harks back to the opening of the new Hicks building in the late 1950s. The two grew up in the store under the tutelage of their father, Ray Bergeron.

"These people who work here are part of the family. I'm having trouble talking about it," Bob Bergeron said, reaching for a handy roll of

toilet paper to catch surprise tears.

Jim Bergeron, 40, was in the second grade when the new store building opened at Northeast Second Street and Roberts Avenue on Feb. 20, 1958. He folded the bandannas given away on opening day and passed out handerchiefs to the ladies.

Their father started Gresham's first sidewalk sale 28 years ago. "And I've worked every one of them," Jim Bergeron said.

Down on the floor, longtime clerks marked merchandise and mourned the passing of an age. "I saw them grow up," Donna Ryan said of the Bergeron brothers. She worked for the store on and off for more than 30 years.

"They seem like big brothers to me," said Betty Koskey, a veteran of 10 years at the store.

"It will be so hard to go by and see it empty said Ruth Waddell, a five-year employee.

The building may not be empty long. Buildi owner Richard Hicks, son of the original W. Hicks, is negotiating for new tenants of the sto

The W. R. Hicks Co. was founded by Walter Hicks in May of 1923. The first meeting of the Gresham Chamber of Commerce was held in the shoe department of W. R. Hicks Co. at its original location, the building presently occupied by Amiton Furniture at the corner of second and Main.

Walter Hicks' son, Richard Hicks, joined the firm in 1945 when he returned from World War 11.

In 1948, after 20 years with the J. C. Penney Co., Mr. Ray Bergeron joined the firm.

Mr. Bergeron and Richard Hicks, as partners, moved the store to its present location at 2nd and Roberts in Feb. of 1958. Walter Hicks remained as merchandising councellor until his death in 1967. At that time the company incorporated.

In late 1969 Richard Hicks sold his 50% of stock in the firm to Bob and Jim Bergeron who had just joined the firm after receiving their business degrees from the University of Oregon.

In July of 1976 the W. R. Hicks Co. expanded its operation to include the Thread Bear at the corner of Main and 2nd St. in Gresham.

In 1979 the Company was honored to receive from the Oregon Retail Council the Oregon Retailer of the Year Award.

The Company is presently operated by Bob and Jim Bergeron and employs 25 full and part-time employees.

In May of this year W. R. Hicks Co. will celebrate its 60th Anniversary.



#### W. R. HICKS COMPANY

#### THE BUILDING:

W. R. Hicks Company was established in the building now occupied by Amiton Furniture Company. The building was constructed in 1912 and was a dry goods company called "Lindsay's". In 1923 L. A. Waack and W. R. Hicks bought the store. Walter Hicks was a silent partner until 1927 when he assumed sole ownership of the business.

The lower floor was always a retail store. The upper floor was used variously by the Masons, the Eagles, a skating rink and other purposes. The skating rink had to go because it shook the entire building, and W. R. Hicks JCompany expanded, using the entire two floors. In 1958 the new W. R. Hicks building was constructed on property formerly operated as a Safeway Store

#### PARTNERS OF THE BUSINESS

Walter Hicks was sole owner in 1927 until his son Walter Richard Hicks, Jr. became a partner in 1936. When Richard went into the service during World War II, Walter Hicks' son-in-law, Donald Rayen, became a partner. After Richard returned from the War, Ragen withdrew from the firm and Ray Bergeron became a partner with W. R. Hicks and son Richard. When Richard retired, Bob and Jiom Bergeron assumed ownership.

#### Personal notes re: Walter R. Hicks

There were long difficult years for the store during the depression. And during the war and shortly thereafter it was impossible to acquire enough good merchandise to do the business that could have been a "boom" time. Even though he was struggling to stay in business himself, Walter Hicks was always willing to help the wholesale salesmen with temporary financing when they were short of funds. During the war, shoes were rationed, and they were of poor material. The store

always had a deficit of shoe stamps, because when the children came in with holes in their shoes, Walter Hicks could not turn them down and it was up to Don Rayen to satisfy the government agency for rationing. Walter Hicks treated his employees and customers equitably and kindly and W. R. Hicks Company still maintains his high standards. He was 84 years old when he built the new store and lived to the age of 94. He was active in the business until age 92.

#### Historians to honor business

W.R. Hicks Co., a Gresham department store that first opened its doors in May 1923, will receive the Gresham Historical Society's pioneer business award at the society's annual Pioneer Appreciation Banquet on Friday, May 13.

The late W.R. Hicks founded the store on the corner of Northeast Second Street and Main Avenue, now the site of Amiton Furniture. In 1932, a group of Gresham businesspeople met in Hicks' shoe department and founded the

In 1948, Walter Hicks' son Richard joined him in business and formed a partnership with Ray J. Bergeron. Ten years later the store was moved to a building three times larger at Southeast Second Street and Roberts Avenue.

Mr. Hicks stayed on as a merchandise counselor until his death in 1967. The store now is owned by the Bergeron family.

In addition to the pioneer business award, the historical society will present volunteer of preservationist awards at the banquet. Guest speaker will be Dick Pintarich, historian and teacher at Mt. Hood Community College, who will talk about transportation in East Multnomah County and the history of street cars.
