

Adoline "Addie" Emily Ceciliani, the matriarch of Division Street Corral, died Sunday, Jan. 5. She was 92.

In its heyday, "D-Street" Corral was a popular dance hall with one of the largest dance floors in the country. Adoline and her husband, Charles, built the east Portland hall in 1948 and ran it until 1979, when a fire (suspected arson) destroyed parts of the building.

D-Street Corral garnered top national acts such as Johnny Cash, The Temptations, Hank Williams, Bobby Darin, Roy Orbison, Paul Revere and the Raiders and The Kingsmen, along with many others.

The Ceciliani family home was located on the 10 acres of corral grounds, and D-Street was a family affair, with everyone participating, from the playpen through high school.

After the 1979 fire, the Cecilianis renovated and eventually leased the corral to renters, including an evangelist, bingo group and flea market.

"Mom never stopped working," said daughter Joanna Ceciliani. "She did all of the accounting and bookkeeping, saving every single receipt from contracts with the bands. She continued to run D-Street after my dad died in 1995. She was such a good business woman."

In 2006, Adoline sold the corral and moved out of the neighborhood she called home for 63

years. Now the D-Street site is a housing development for Habitat for Humanity, Division Street Corral Estates.

Adoline was born Jan. 17, 1921, in Portland to Emily Hulda and John Augusta Seifert. She graduated from Girls Polytechnic High School.

As a seamstress, Adoline won national recognition for her tailoring skills. She won numerous trophies through the Dogwood Garden Club for her floral arrangements that she donated weekly to banks and libraries.

A cook, baker and canner, Adoline epitomized hospitality, providing meals for her family and many others who stopped by her home.

Adoline and Charles met at Flanagan's Restaurant in the

early 1940s. They married and together raised four children, all of whom still live in the Portland area.

She loved music, singing and playing the guitar, instilling a love of entertainment in the next generation.

In an Aug. 23, 1973, story about the Ceciliani children's involvement with New Oregon Singers, they called Adoline their greatest promoter.

"None of us ever remember her ever raising her voice," Joanna said. "She was just the sweetest person."

Adoline is survived by her four children, Arthur, Joanna (married to Doug Beckman), Carl and Jeannie (twins) Ceciliani; four grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren.

Her greatest days in life were the weddings of Colin to Tiffany and Conor to Lauren, and the birth of her grandson, Elliott on July 5, 2015. Randy was born to be a grandmother. She and Elliott became well known on social media for Randy's video postings of their exploits as she cared for Elliott on days she called

"Nana Wednesdays."

Several sisters-in-law, brothers-in-law, nieces, nephews and other relatives also survive Randy.

Randy was a champion Hood River County 4-H equestrian rider; worked at the Hood River News throughout high school; and with friends started a folk group that to this day still gathers once or so each year to sing and laugh about old times. Randy attended Willamette University for two years after graduating from Hood River High School in 1969. At Willamette, she sang and travelled to Europe with the Willamette Choir. As a junior, she transferred to the University of Oregon, where she graduated with a degree in journalism. While in school, Randy worked as a production manager at the UO student newspaper. Upon graduating, she worked for a year at Oregon State University before starting her career in community journalism at the Tigard Times in July 1974.

The Clarks were married in April 1975 and moved to Pendleton, where Randy taught journalism at Blue Mountain Community College; worked at a prominent law firm; and worked part-time at the local daily newspaper. In 1977, the couple moved to West Linn as Randy began teaching at Clackamas Community College.

Randy's career in communications flourished at an early age as she directed marketing and communications for the YMCA of Columbia-Willamette

throughout Portland and later launched her own agency: Nickelsen Clark Advertising and Public Relations. Among her professional achievements was unveiling to the nation and the world the quality of the budding Oregon wine industry in the 1980s as manager of the Oregon Wine Advisory Board.

Ever the journalist, Randy joined husband Steve in 1996 by purchasing Community Newspapers Inc., the Westside Portland-area newspapers where she once worked as a young professional.

Randy always viewed her sons, Colin and Conor, as her greatest achievement. As a parent, she raised them with love, encouragement, firmness and the expectation that they would be accountable and treat others with fairness and respect. Along the way and through her sons, Randy became a surrogate mother and close friend to many young men and women, who received hugs, support and tough love when needed. On many a night, the Clark house was filled with unrelated "sons and daughters," who Randy always made time to care for and nurture.

As her boys attended Tigard schools, Randy served as community, school and youth sports leader and fundraiser. She was a silent, but constant reminder to many men that women actually knew more about how to get just about any job done right and more completely than most men. In fact, beginning as a teen, Randy was an early

advocate for women's rights and social justice.

Randy later displayed her care and concern for young women serving as the alumni adviser for the Alpha Chi Omega sorority at Oregon State. Along with other volunteers, Randy helped provide an emphasis on strong academics, philanthropy, community service, and appropriate social behavior for hundreds of sorority members through the years. The sorority and its members now are considered among the best at OSU.

In her honor, the Alpha Chi Omega sorority has created an academic scholarship for qualified women. Randy's battle with ovarian cancer began in April 2014. Consistent with her character, Randy immediately took on learning about the disease as her occupation, and she engaged in a relentless commitment to help support education, discovery and research. Bravely, she would hold the hands of her OHSU doctor, Koen De Geest, urging him to work quickly - not to save her own life - but to find a way to diagnose the disease earlier and provide for treatments to save the lives of other women in the future.





Robert (Bob) Chess passed away peacefully on October 5 at his residence in Gresham.



Dick was proud of and devoted to his family. He relished each achievement. Future family successes will ring somewhat hollow without his ready appreciation.

Dick was preceded in death by his siblings. He is survived by Barbara, his three daughters (and their husbands), his five grandchildren (and one spouse), and one great-granddaughter.

Dick adamantly refused to have a memorial or funeral. His remains have been inurned at Willamette National Cemetery. To celebrate his life, take a stroll in a Gresham park or visit Oxbow Park. If you want



OBITUARY

Paul Edward Coakley was born on August 8, 1953 at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, Michigan. Always an early riser, it's not surprising that he arrived 2 months early, earning him an admission to the Neonatal ICU.

He spent his early childhood in Detroit, with his mother Alvilda Fisher, his father Paul Coakley and his 7 older siblings, Bobby, Alma Catherine, Mae Frances, Gwendolyn, Elma Dean, James, and Paula. He later found himself as an older brother, for the first time, to a younger sister Wanda. Around the age of 9, he moved to Gallatin, Tennessee to live with his aunt Irene Coakley, uncle Joseph Coakley and younger sister Deborah. He graduated from Gallatin High School in 1971, shortly after his school was integrated. Unsurprisingly, he was voted the "friendliest student" by his fellow seniors. He obtained his Associate's degree from Volunteer State Community College and both his Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Middle Tennessee State University. After college, he first started working as an English teacher at Holloway High School in Murfreesboro, Tennessee.

In 1973, he married the love of his life, Carlus, in Gallatin, Tennessee. In 1976, Paul and Carlus welcomed their oldest son, Paul Coakley Jr. In 1980, Paul moved his family from Murfreesboro, Tennessee to Portland, Oregon and, the very next year, their youngest son Brian was born. Shortly after arriving in Oregon, Paul and Carlus were warmly welcomed into the congregation at Mount Olivet Baptist Church. During the next 41 years, he served at Mount Olivet as an usher, a deacon, a life group leader and as the fellowship ministry director. Most recently, he was serving as a teacher for weekly Bible-study classes.

As an educator, Paul dedicated his life to the teaching and mentoring of young people. After working for several years as a teacher at Harriet Tubman Middle School, he was later promoted to Vice Principal and later Principal. After ten years as the principal there, he later worked as the principal of Roosevelt High School and, later, Gresham High School before retiring in 2002. 
