**Professional inspection interaction is not confrontation. It is preparation.**

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## Three Principles

**Knowledge reduces fear** - Understanding how inspections function removes uncertainty.

**Documentation creates protection** - What is recorded matters during and after the inspection.

**Professional conduct creates leverage** - How you interact influences how decisions are applied.

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## Five Things to Do During an Inspection

- Stay calm and professional
  - Observe and document
  - Ask for clarification
  - Understand the decision basis
  - Know your appeal timeline
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## What Operators Often Miss

Most operators do not lack compliance. They lack a structured way to assess inspection direction in real time.

This leads to unnecessary corrective actions, inconsistent decisions across locations, and avoidable operational and capital cost.

Inspection outcomes are not always driven by regulation alone. They are shaped by interpretation and response.
