

This year, Pastor Gunia will be writing on piety and spirituality. The intention is to help you live your life with increasing joy, closeness to God, and love for others. Don't take these as the Law, but rather think of them as suggestions from someone who's been working on his personal piety for quite some time now and who would love to see your faith grow stronger.

Read the Holy Scriptures.

God's word is not like human words in two ways that are of particular importance to your spirituality.

First, when God speaks, his words call the thing of which he is speaking into creation. When God spoke of light in Genesis 1, light came into being. When God spoke the words "this is my body...this is my blood" over the bread and wine, they became his body and blood. Likewise, when you read God's words of forgiveness or peace or love in the Bible, God actually gives you these things. And when you read of Jesus, God actually gives you Jesus.

Second, when God speaks, he cannot lie. God can only communicate the truth to you. In the Scriptures are no mistakes, no attempts to deceive or mislead, no falsehoods. When God tells you of historical events like creation, the fall into sin, the details of a particular battle, or the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus, happened just as Scripture tells you. When God makes a promise to you, that promise is completely and totally trustworthy. When God bestows an identity on you, you are precisely who God says you are.

There is no better way to grow in your faith than by humbling yourself, clearing your mind, and listening to God's words as they are printed in the Scriptures, read in the Church, and proclaimed in worship. None. Absolutely none.

Exercise doesn't get you closer to God. Yoga or meditation doesn't get you closer to God. Working or classical music or creating art doesn't get you closer to God. These might touch something deep within you, but only God (working through his Word) can shape your soul as a potter shapes clay.

Further, all the other acts of piety I'm writing about this year all stem from the Word of God; without God's word, they are empty and of no value.

Last month, I wrote about giving generously. Without faithful obedience to God's word, trust in his promises, and trust that he makes your offerings holy, they are of no value.

If you were to pray apart from the Scriptures, how do you know to whom you're praying? How do you know you're praying in accordance with God's will? How do you even know that God hears your prayers?

It is the Word of God which turns bread, wine, and water into blessed Sacraments. It is the Word of God that calls people together in worship and makes them holy. God's words, spoken by human beings, forgive your sins.

All faith is rooted in God's Word. Therefore, read the Holy Scriptures.

1. Make a plan to spend time reading the Bible each week and stick to that plan. If you fall off the rails, just pick it up again as soon as you can. There is no race to see who can read the Bible the quickest or the largest amount of times. Reading the Bible is a daily discipline that allows God to work in you for your eternal good.

2. Find out what the readings for the next Sunday are and read those lessons. Since everything in a worship service flows out from those readings, you will get so much more out of the sermon, the prayers, the hymns, and other elements of worship.

3. Attend Bible study. I hold a Masters of Divinity degree. I wrote a 25-page paper on one psalm. I've translated entire books of the Bible from the original languages. And I always learn something from an observation made from someone else in Bible class. I would bet the same will be true of you.

4. Try carving out 5-10 minutes each day to read the Bible. Start with a very brief prayer, set a timer, read, and stop right where you're at. Say another brief prayer and go on with your day.

5. If you have a question, ask me about it. I actually like talking about the Bible. I'm never too busy to help you grow in your faith and understanding.

The Word of God calls us into being, forgives our sins, makes us children of God, and fills our hearts with every good thing. Therefore, we hold to God's Word and treat it as the most precious thing we own. Everything in your house will perish. You will perish. But God's Word endures forever and will bring you into eternity with it.
