Easter Egg Hunt

We are looking forward to the Easter egg hunt on 4/13. Students do not have to wear their school uniforms and are welcome to dress in a nice Easter outfit complete with a basket to collect eggs.

Please bring 2 bags of plastic eggs (approx. 24 eggs total) and 2 bags unopened, individually wrapped candies by Friday, 4/8. Our teachers will fill the eggs. Make sure candy does not contain nuts, are not spicy, are not minty, or other adult flavors. As a substitute for candy, you can bring small trinkets, erasers, stickers, or small toys. (Infant class does not participate.)

Children age 4 and over need to have a copy of their hearing and vision records in their school file. If your child is age 4 years or older before 9/1/21, please bring a copy of their screening test records.

Summer Supply Fee (\$100) will be due with the tuition payment on May 1. The Fall Supply Fee (\$150) will be due on June 1. Paying the supply fee at the end of the Spring semester holds your place in class for Fall.
