By engaging in these observations, parents can foster a deeper understanding of their child's unique needs and interests, allowing for more intentional support and a harmonious alignment with Montessori principles.

Here are a few housekeeping items for new students and reminders for continuing students.

Drop off: Say good-byes and give hugs in the lobby. Your child will walk to his/her class by themselves. If your child needs help, a teacher in the lobby can assist.

Pick up: Stay in the lobby and the receptionist will call your child's teacher via the intercom.

Take your water bottle home every day to be cleaned. Return every morning filled with fresh water.

A tip on separation anxiety: Draw a little heart on the palm of your child's hand and kiss it. Tell your child if they miss you during the day, they have your heart in their hand.

If your child will be absent, please email the office by 10 a.m.

If your child needs sunblock, you may leave it at school. Make sure to label with his/her name.

To communicate with your child's teacher, send a message via Childpilot or email, If you need to meet with the teacher, please schedule an appointment.
