Mid-Autumn/Moon Festival – Oct. 6, 2025


The festival celebrates three fundamental concepts that are closely connected:

- **Thanksgiving**, to give thanks for the harvest, or for harmonious unions
- Praying (asking for conceptual or material satisfaction), such as for babies, a spouse, beauty, longevity, or for a good future

Traditions and myths surrounding the festival are formed around these concepts. Although traditions have changed over time due to changes in technology, science, economy, culture, and religion, it's always been about being together.

We will celebrate at school by sampling moon cakes, doing a Moon Festival craft, and learn the story of the Mid-Autumn Festival.
