



The Mobile Sensory Dignity Space

A calm, sensory-friendly RV where autistic and disabled kids can reset — then return to the fun.

THE PROBLEM

Events aren't built for every nervous system.

Festivals, parades, sports days, and fireworks move fast and loud. For autistic and disabled children, the noise, crowds, and lights quickly become too much — and there is rarely anywhere to go. Families end up in cars, in bathrooms, or leaving hours early.

1 in 6 *children*

in the U.S. has a developmental disability. Most are quietly excluded from full community life.

THE SOLUTION

A retrofitted Type C RV. Built for reset.



INCLUDE is purchasing and outfitting a used Type C RV as a Mobile Sensory Dignity Space. It travels to community events and parks on-site — a calm room on wheels.

Inside: soft lighting, comfortable seating, sensory tools, sound dampening, and trained staff. Outside: a parent check-in tent — a visible front door, no explanation needed.

Not an exit. A pause button — so families can stay for the whole day.
