
How League Works:


There are 2 full leagues each semester on both Monday and Tuesday nights. The league is broken up into 4 weeks. Each week members will play 5 matches per week (unless they are making up matches from another week) culminating in a 20-match season. There is a finals tournament after each league has concluded as well. Members can be as competitive as they wish. It *can* be treated as only a social event for fun, members can try to win as many matches as possible, or players can ignore wins/loses and just try to earn their highest average score. There is no expectation of members beyond safety in regard to our league. Officers, The Cut coaches, and more experienced members are always available to help struggling members.

How Matches Work:

Aggie Blades now follows the International Axe Throwing Federation (IATF) match-play and rules. All regular season matches consist of three rounds per match. Each round consists of 5 throws per player. Players must win 2 of 3 rounds to win the match. During the regular season, all 3 rounds are played even if a player has won the first two. Players switch sides between each round. If players are tied after 3 rounds, the winner will be decided by a big axe showdown. IATF Scoring and Rules:





The bullseye (center black circle) is worth 5 points, the red circle is worth 3 points, and the blue circle is worth 1 point. The clutch (green dot) in the upper corner is worth 7 points. Clutches are only available on throw 5 of each round. Players must also make intention of throwing at a clutch known before throwing for points to count.

All scoring (except clutches) is based on the location of the majority of the blade penetrating the surface of the target board. This is exemplified by the graphic above on the right. The dotted green lines show the scored area. Clutches only require a player's blade to be in contact with the green circle at the surface.

Players are responsible for calling their own scores. Players should also confirm opponents score to discourage any potential for cheating. If there is a disagreement for a score, a third party can be called in to make a final decision.

League Finals refers to the tournament at the end of the league season (5th week). It will be only for members of the league to compete in. It is generally a fun end to a season. This can also be taken as seriously or laid-back as members want. An award will be given to the winner(s) of league finals each semester.

At the moment, this is the only planned fundraiser we have. Members will be asked to volunteer to help work the tournament if they are not competing in it as well. Tournaments will take several hours, please plan accordingly. Plans may change depending on how many teams we have sign up. More in-depth details to come.

Safety

Safety Guidelines:

In general, axe throwing is a safe sport, and the rules are rather simple. The most important thing to remember is **COMMON SENSE** will eliminate most risks. This means don't try to twirl axes, throw at other people, stand in front of targets, etc. Also, make sure both people throwing in an arena have thrown before going to retrieve your axe. Do not attempt any trick shots (unless otherwise told by Cut Crew). Finally, and most importantly, listen to The Cut staff and Aggie Blades officers! If they tell you to do something or not do something in regard to throwing, then it is both for your safety and for your own personal improvement.

Accident Protocols:

In the event of an accident, there are two main protocols to be followed. If the incident is not serious (not requiring professional medical treatment), we will just make a note of the accident and use the first aide kit on-site. For a serious incident, an officer, Cut Crew member, and/or other member with a vehicle at The Cut will be available to drive the injured party to the emergency room. An accident report will be filled out and the President will reach out to the emergency contact on file.

Attendance:

Attendance in league is optional; however, members must complete 20 games in order to compete in the League Finals Tournament. Matches can be made up, but habitually missing league makes it harder to schedule makeups. Members must help with at least one fundraiser tournament. If there are any concerns with meeting the aforementioned requirements, then contact either the President or Vice President to formulate a solution.
