How to Prepare Recyclables

Place ALL recyclable materials loose in can. Make sure caps and lids are removed from plastic and glass bottles and jars (lids can be placed with recyclables too). If you store your recyclables in a paper/plastic bag, please empty all recyclables out of bag and into can. Paper bags can be placed into can; however, Plastic bags will not be accepted and must be placed in garbage. Shredded paper must be stapled in a paper bag before placing in can.
