BACKGROUND

I am an experienced archaeologist and bioarchaeologist. I have studied and excavated since 1992 and have been teaching bioarchaeology at the University of London (Birkbeck) since 2004. I am a Research Fellow at the University of Winchester, and a Research Associate at the University of South Africa. I carry out analyses on skeletal populations, with particular emphasis on life history and trauma analysis. I head up the KHD Research Project in Northern Egypt, seeking to understand the biological correlates of state formation, and work as senior bioarchaeologist for a number of other major projects in Peru, Egypt, South Africa, Ghana and Bolivia. I carry out forensic work on Spanish Civil War graves (via the ARMH) and am a board member for the Egyptian Cultural Heritage Organisation (ECHO).
