Association Dues

Road Improvements

Dur third round of road repairs will be completed in February 2024. As with previous work, the ALPO Board surveyed the state of all platted roads within Ashe Lake, and formulated a plan that considers road status as well as traffic volume. As Winter in the High Country gets underway ALPO is monitoring all the road conditions and will take action if warranted. This is a breakdown of road work completed to date.

The 1st phase (completed September 2023) included portions of:

Lakeside Drive and lower Pritchard Drive Chestnut Drive at intersection of Holiday Lane Holiday Lane at intersection of Lakeside Drive Dawnview Drive

2nd phase (completed October 2023) included portions of:

Chestnut Drive Monticello Drive Freedom Trail Lakeside Drive above dam on both sides

3rd phase (To be completed February 2024) portions of:

Holiday Lane Lakeside Drive at Ashe Drive Lakeside Drive culverts to be flushed Pritchard Drive at Ravenwood Drive Dawnview Drive at Beaver Creek Drive Dawnview Drive

We realize that the roads are a priority for all homeowners. Road maintenance and up-keep is an ongoing issue with our old roads that are not paved, and scheduling of work is at the mercy of our unpredictable mountain weather. We believe that the current capital improvement plan will minimize requirements for ongoing road maintenance and will benefit all of Ashe Lake in the long run. Thank you for your patience with our progress.


<u>Ashe Lake Dam - Update</u>

ALPO is currently working with Bander Smith, Inc. to formulate a plan of action for the dam repairs. We have recently received historical records from the NC Department of Environmental Quality and these are being utilized by Bander Smith, Inc to formulate a repair plan which can be submitted to the State for their approval. As previously mentioned, the needed repairs will be in excess of \$ 100,000, funds that ALPO does not have. ALPO is in the process of applying for a FEMA & other government grants sponsored by the State of North Carolina for private dams such as ours. Funding determination are expected late Spring 2024.

At this time the dam IS NOT at an elevated risk of failure, however the State requires that the dam be fully operational, and that all of the issues identified be corrected.

Once we finalize a repair / replacement scope with our contractor, and receive State approval we will again reach out to all our members to fund these much needed repairs. If repairs are not completed in a timely manner the State may force the lake to be drained until such time as the repairs are completed. We would like to avoid that outcome.

Ashe Lake is a fundamental part of our community and we are doing everything we can in order to ensure it remains so. If you have any information regarding the Lake you feel may be helpful to us, please do not hesitate to contact us.




<u>Snow Clearing / Removal</u>

ALPO has contracted with GAMCO for snow removal for the 2023/2024 winter season. They will be clearing the roads through the community during snow events as needed, however ALPO is <u>not responsible for private roads or driveways</u>. GAMCO will not be clearing any private drives, and all owners should make arrangements in the event of snow.

<u>Winter Weather</u>




