Road Improvements

Our second round of road repairs are scheduled for the week of October 30th. As with previous work, the ALPO Board has surveyed the state of all platted roads within Ashe Lake, and have formulated a plan that considers road status as well as traffic volume. Wolverine Excavation will be working on these areas. Thru-traffic will be maintained, however delays may be unavoidable and will be minimized.

We realize that the roads are a priority for all homeowners. We believe that the current capital improvement plan will minimize requirements for ongoing road maintenance and will benefit all of Ashe Lake in the long run. Thank you for your patience with our progress.

Ashe Lake Water Levels & Dam Condition

You may have noticed that the water levels in the Lake are lower than usual. The State of North Carolina is in a drought, with Ashe County experiencing the 25th driest September in 129 years of records. Despite low rain, we are concerned with the Lake level.



NC Department of Environmental Quality sent two inspectors to visit the dam on Tuesday, October 17th. They have provided us with a Notice of Inspection which lists several items we are working to remedy. Foremost on this list is the condition of the gate valve of the dam which is not operational at this time. We have no way to restrict flow thru the Gate Valve of the dam, until it is repaired, which unfortunately will result in lower water levels unless we get rain.

ALPO has engaged with a specialty contracting firm that focuses on dam repair, inspection, and construction. They are scheduled to complete their site assessment of our Lake and dam within the next three weeks, and upon completion we the loss of water level will be remedied. They will also provide us with a maintenance plan to keep our structures in the best shape possible, as well as addressing the other items mentioned by the State. We have already completed some of the punch list items provided by the State such as replacing the locks, and removal of debris from the damn structures.

From the information we have gathered it appears that no maintenance has been performed on the dam structures / mechanisms since 2017. If you have any historical information regarding the dam, maintenance, reports, etc we ask that you reach out to the Board and help us preserve this much cherished asset.

While this work is ongoing - we recommend that property owners on the Lake consider this time for dock maintenance or removal of dilapidated docks and debris. The work will be easier (and cheaper) to do while the water levels are low and the dock substructures are exposed.

The stake in the below photo marks the water level as of Wednesday, October $25^{\rm th}$, 2023.



For reference the below photo shows lake water levels in 2015/2016 due to a drought summer. There was no intervention by ALPO and the Lake bounced back.

We have truly enjoyed the Full Moon Floats and can't wait to start them up again come spring.




Wolly Worm Winter Prediction




Snow Removal
