But nfter hundreds of hours of investigative work by LAPD detectives-which included locating survetllance video footage of her border crossing-police say that she willingly chose to disappear. "To date, the investigation has not uncovered any evidence that Kobayashi is being trafficked or is tl1evictim of foul play," LAPD chief Jim McDonnell said during a Dec. 2 press conference. "She has a right to her privacy, and we respect her choices, but we also understand the concern her loved ones feel for her:"

"They're absolutely convinced that there is noll1ing voluntary about Hnnnah doing tJ1is," says the fan1ily's attorney and spokeswoman Sara A.zari. "V111y\vould she plan a trip, text her uncle alldaunt and say, 'I'n1 on 1ny,vay,' thenjust go off the grid?"

Hannah's worried friends and family hold jump-startu,gsearc.h efforts in l\licxico. The group plans to drum up coverage for l1erin the Mexican media and get avolunteer tea1ntogether to comb the region, says Azari: "It's not over."
