As many of you already know, Peter Haberfeld passed away at his home in Oakland, California on December 1, 2021. Peter was a labor attorney and community organizer throughout his adult life. The highlights of his activism are presented in detail in the link provided below to obituaries that were written by close friends. They describe a fascinating and full life that began on a farm in the Willamette Valley of Oregon. Peter was descended from Austrian and Swiss ancestors who fled Europe during the rise of the Nazis. Peter was always on a mission to advance the well-being of the poor and working people. Early in his career as a graduate of U.C. Berkeley Law School, Peter spent several years working as a lawyer for the nascent United Farm Workers
