

The November election is fast approaching. It is one of the most important election in decades. We want to provide you with information that will assist you in making your decisions. As former CTA employees, we should consider CTA's candidate recommendations. CTA recommends candidates based on interviews by CTA members. Chief importance in receiving a CTA recommendation is the candidate's support for public education and union values. To access the information, do the following:



Input "CTA Campaign 2018" in your computer search engine. This will bring up the CTA campaign 2018.

Click on "Campaign Recommendations". This will give you a page with all CTA recommendations for:

- Statewide office candidates
- Recommendations for statewide ballot propositions
- California State Assembly (AD)
- California State Senate (SD)
- U.S. Congress (CD)

All of the districts are numbered. The lowest numbered districts are in the Northern part of the state, the higher numbers are in the South.

For example: AD 2 is in the North Coast and AD 80 is in South San Diego County

You can use your county issued voter quide to see which district numbers apply to you.

You can access any of the subjects on the left side of the page for more info about CTA's campaign. Click on the "Take Action" button and see how you can be involved.
