## **Survey Results**

We mailed a survey form with a stamped return addressed envelope to our 325 members in June, 2014. We have 181 returns representing 56% of those surveyed. Here are returns ranked in order of importance as ranked by members with one being highest and 6 lowest:

- 2. Socialization/fellowship opportunities
- 3. Organizing for persuasion of pressure
- 4. Money management for retirees
