# Health & Welfare Trust Report Merri Boston Trust Liaison

At the CTA Employees' Health and Welfare Benefits Trust meeting held June 17, 2016, the Trustees received presentations from representatives of Express Scripts and Anthem Blue Cross. These presentations included current performance data and consideration of benefit changes/enhancements.

Per the Express Scripts presentation, the RX "Total Plan Cost" for the year increased 22.5%, largely due to an increase in Specialty Drugs. Specialty Drugs to treat Hepatitis C, Cancer, and Multiple Sclerosis are the primary categories driving a 64% increase. The good news about the Specialty Drugs being used to treat Hep C is that the cost is high, but limited. The cure rate is very successful and treatment is for one year and not ongoing. As these treatments end, so will the extreme costs. Inflation is the cost driver for non-specialty drugs.

In past years, the Health Trust received limited retiree drug subsidies from Medicare due to providing an employer based drug plan. Currently, the Trust participates in an Employer Group Waiver Plan (EGWP) for retirees, as a way to achieve significant plan savings compared to the subsidies. In 2015, there was a savings of \$42,166 with the CTA EGWP.

All Medicare eligible participants will receive the Annual Notice of Change, 2017 formulary and mail order form from Express Scripts by 10/1/2016. All **new** Medicare participants will receive a welcome kit complete with an ID card, benefit overview, formulary and evidence of coverage book as enrollment is received by Earhart and approved by CMS.

The presentation from Anthem Blue Cross included information on a 5.2% decrease in PMPM (per member per month) cost from the previous period; in-network utilization, which is up from last year at 87.9%; and the use of the Anthem Live Health Online program. A new feature of the Live Health Online program is a mental health component. Anthem participants can make an appointment and speak privately with a psychologist or therapist from a comfortable environment like their home. Evening and weekend appointments are available. Co-pays are the same as with an in-office therapy visit, but the cost to the Trust for the online visit is greatly reduced. Anthem Blue Cross is in the process of acquiring CIGNA, but as of recent developments, this is being blocked by the Dept. of Justice.

## **Health & Welfare Trust Report – continued**

During the Benefits Committee Report, the Trustees approved the following recommendations of the committee.

To comply with the Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act will remove the limits listed below, effective September 1, 2016:

- a. The calendar limit of 100 days per calendar year does not apply to visits for the treatment of mental health or substance abuse for coverage in an out-ofnetwork skilled nursing facility.
- b. The \$350 per admission limit for out-of-network outpatient facilities for mental health or substance abuse is removed.


In addition, the Trustees approved adjusting the Medicare Part B premium reimbursement for the April-June 2016 quarter by decreasing it by \$50.70, unless the administrator has written documentation that the standard premium is \$121.80 per month. (Background: Per the Medicare website, the standard Medicare Part B premium for 2016 is \$121.80 for **new retirees**; however, the standard Medicare Part B premium for retirees prior to 2016 is \$104.90. An overpayment was made to the retirees whose premium is \$104.90. A new procedure will be followed to request the retiree to provide the Trust Administrator with a confirmation of their annual Medicare Part B standard premium, beginning in 2017.)

As part of this meeting, which is also referred to as the "Rate Setting" meeting, the Trust Consultant provides the Trustees with additional detail and analysis of the yearly cost and funding amounts, while previewing renewal agreements. The cost increase for all Health and Welfare Benefit programs is projected to be 3.9%. However, the effect of the new employer contribution rate of 16% of payroll is evident in the Consultant's Income and Expense projections for the coming year. The Income and Expense Report for plan year 2016-17 for both Actives and Retirees, based on a 4% investment return, projects an overall surplus of \$437k. For Retirees only, the projected surplus is \$1.1 million.

There was no discussion, or action taken, by the Trustees on the pending item involving the agreement to obtain three vendor bids, including one from CVT, for a "Standard" health plan, which was to take place by June 1, 2015. REACTA will communicate news of any action as soon as it is known.

# CTA EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT TRUST MEETING Marianne McCarty - Retirement Trust Liaison

The Retirement Trust meeting took place on June 21, 2016. I attended the Budget Committee meeting before the general meeting, but, again, the only issue discussed at that committee was the Trust's rehab plan. I will cover it under the general meeting.

At the general meeting, Josh Kevan of RVK stated that because of the volatility in the markets in 2016, the Plan cannot expect much of an increase in investments. The Plan's investments were up 1.65% through May and 2.37% YTD. RVK recommends some changes in the real estate and real asset fund investments. A motion was passed to make these changes. In answer to a question about return, Josh said there is a 50% probability that the median return for the next 10 years will be 6.35%.

The Operations committee recommended a four-year cycle for the compliance audit. This motion passed.

The Budget committee deferred to the actuary for a discussion of the rehab plan which was the main discussion for the rest of the meeting. Since I do not have access to the documents given to the trustees and I have not been a party to their ongoing discussions, I cannot discuss the plan in detail.

The development of a default schedule for the rehab plan must be adopted by the trustees with input from the bargaining parties. The rehab period starts on 1/1/18. The Plan must reduce benefits that can be reduced, however, they cannot be reduced to less than 1% of contributions. The CTA Plan does not have many such benefits such as death and disability benefits. Because this Plan is based on highest month's pay, a percentage of contributions can be different for each person.

The early retirement subsidy is huge in this Plan. Costs to the Plan can go down by 25% if the early retirement subsidy is eliminated prospectively. There is greater value to the subsidy between the ages of 50 and 55. The actuaries recommend that this subsidy be reduced going forward. This could save about \$2.5 million per year. The service calculator could also be reduced going forward, perhaps from 3% to 2.35%, for example.

The credit balance is causing red zone status. It is difficult to predict. Now that the Plan is in the red zone, we can use extensions to help keep the credit balance positive longer. It is still valid to use the 8% return assumption but it leaves no margin for error. The actuary thinks there should be a cushion so the schedule does not have to be changed every year. Examples were given comparing changes in contribution rates or benefit reductions.

This discussion continued in the afternoon but I had to leave at this time. The dates for the trust meetings in the coming fiscal year are as follows: September 26 2016, December 13, 2016, March 21, 2017, and June 15, 2017. I will not be able to attend either of the next two meetings. I hope when we meet in Cambria, someone else may volunteer to attend future meetings.
