According to our bylaws, the first purpose of REACTA is to protect the benefit levels provided by our pension and health trusts. REACTA officers and chairs have worked diligently monitoring actions being considered by both trusts. We have established and nurtured relationships with labor and management trustees, and leadership of CTA, CSO and CAS so we are not surprised by items being discussed at their meetings. Our effort to push back on a proposed Medicare Advantage Plan was successful because of these relationships. Work in this area continues to be our top priority.

The second purpose of REACTA was on hold during the past 18 months of the pandemic. Our in-person interaction was limited, but our Zoom meetings were very successful in connecting members throughout the country for cocktails, discussions and our 2020 Annual Meeting. We moved forward with planning our 2021 Annual Meeting as a "live" event in Cambria. We believed a safe environment could be provided. We ended up with one of our highest registrations ever with 84 potential attendees, fulfilling our contract obligations with Cambria Pines Lodge. We did have a few cancellations close to our start date but ended up with more attendees than we had in 2019. ## COMMITTEE REPORTS Q & A

Q: Who would be most affected if the CTA Health and Welfare Trust converted to the Anthem Medicare Advantage plan?
 A: Anthem/Medicare participants only

Q: Why did the REACTA Officers request a virtual meeting with the Benefits Committee Trustees and the Trust Consultant?A: High level of concern and anticipated issues raised by REACTA members.

**Q**: Will the Anthem Medicare Advantage Plan continue to be an issue? **A:** Yes, the Benefits Committee will Review the Plan proposal annually. REACTA will continue to monitor this issue.

Q: What is the projected return rate on the Pension Trust?A: Based on reports from the trust professionals, it was lowered from 7.5% to 7.0% for future years.

Q: What zone are we in and what is the projection on the zone issue?
A: Red zone in 2020 but the actuaries project 3 improving years into the yellow zone, and green zone by 2024.

**Q:** What caused the improvement?

A: Improvements made in the last tri-partite bargaining were primary factors.

**Q:** What is the charge of the Fiscal Oversight Committee?

A: Create a monthly guide of the Treasurer's duties and Fiscal Policies and Procedures.

**Q:** What are the goals of the Membership Committee? **A:** Make REACTA a "household" name with active CTA staff and, secondly, to encourage current members to switch from cash dues to automatic pension deduction.

**Q:** What is REACTA's current membership? **A:** *364 members* 



**Q**: Are Student Scholarships still available?

**A**: Yes. A new shorter application will be available on the REACTA.org website in January.


