Venue for the Fifth Session of the Provisional World Parliament

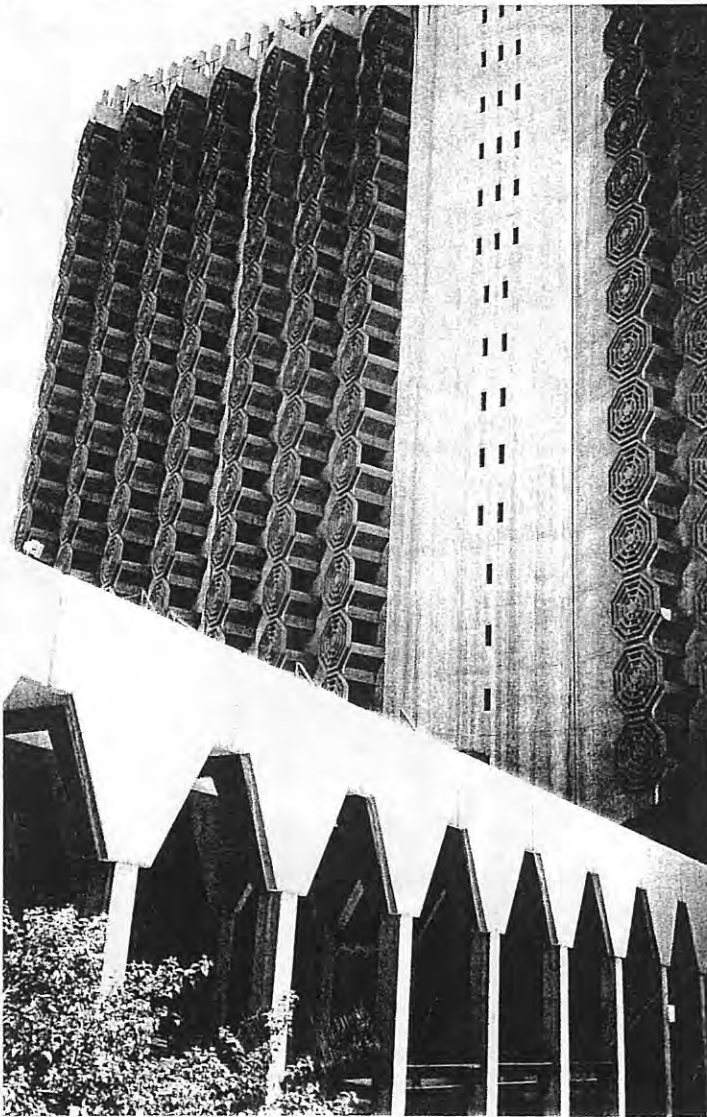

The Fifth Session of the Provisional World Parliament is officially hosted by the Global Ratification and Elections Network (GREN), the Government of Iraq, and the Non-Aligned Students and Youth Organization (NASYO), which has branches in more than 80 countries and is headquartered in Baghdad.

One reason Baghdad was chosen for 1999 is because the Government of Iraq is sufficiently independent to resist pressures which have resulted in the denial of visas to most of our delegates to all meetings and conventions, beginning with the 3rd Session at Miami Beach, Florida, in 1987.

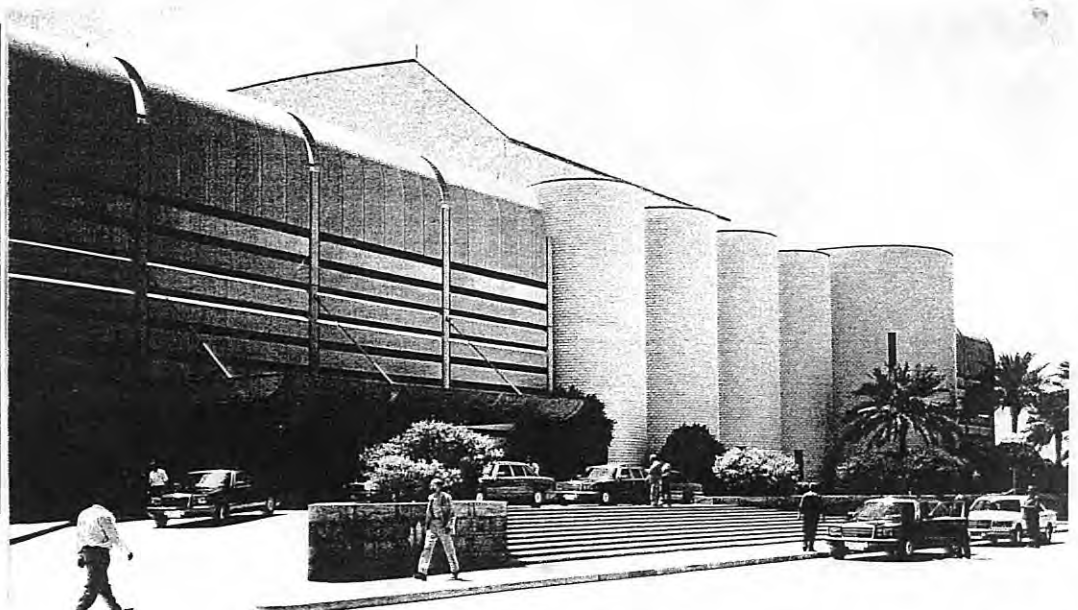

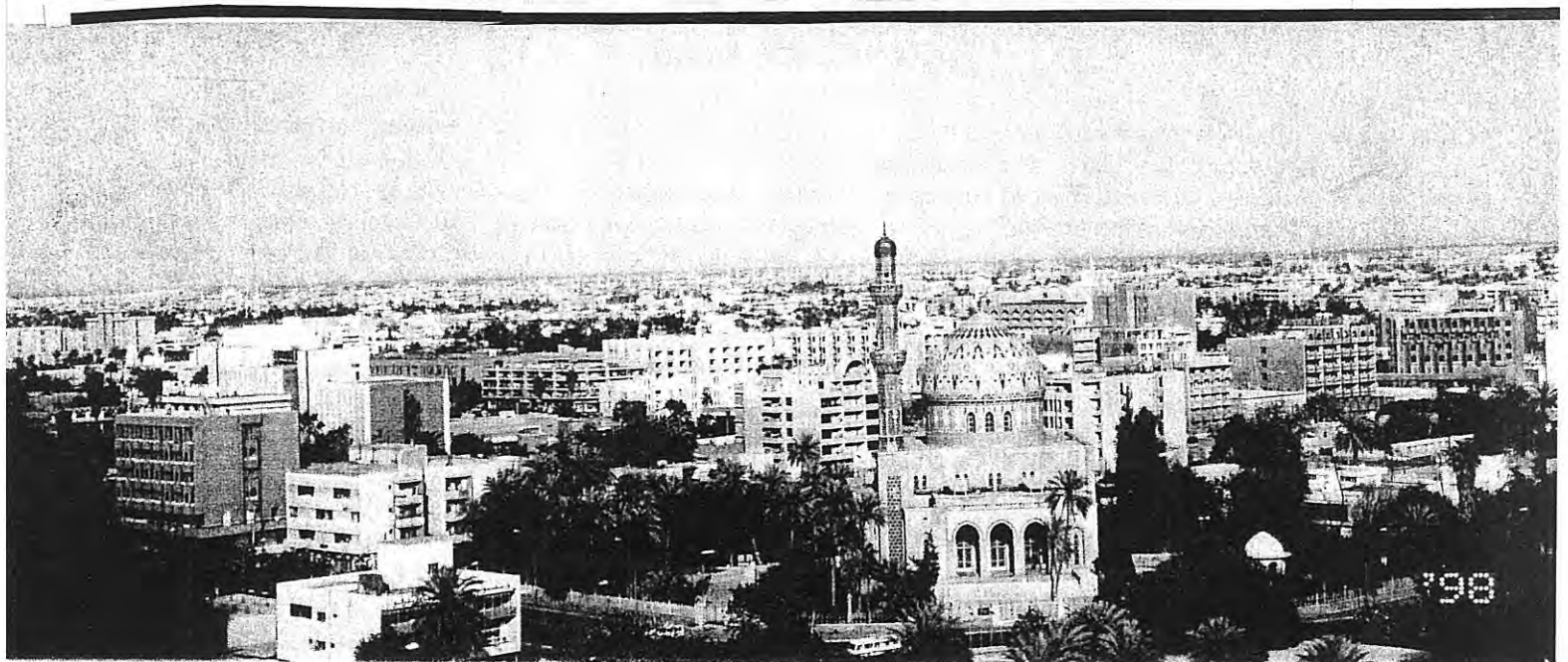

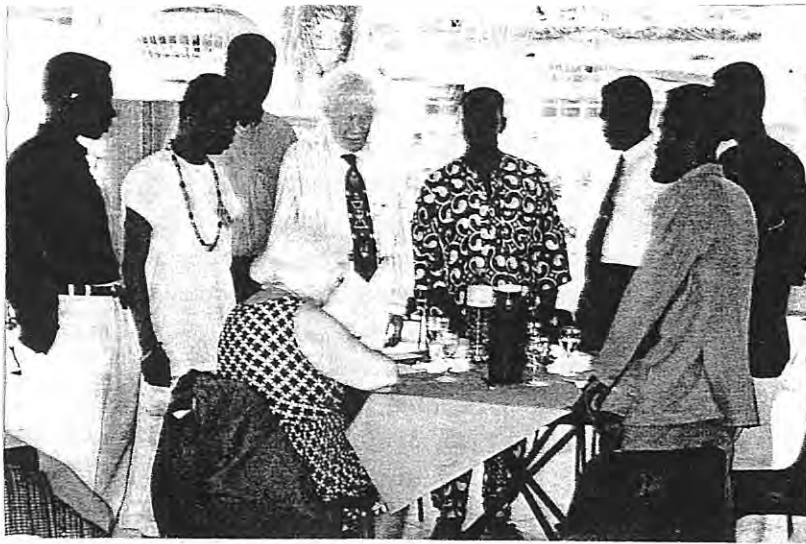

Those of you who filled out an earlier registration form which did not include passport number or expiration date will need to provide WCPA headquarters with this information. To expedite the obtaining of visas to Iraq, all delegates must supply the WCPA with a passport number and date of expiration. Further information on obtaining visas to Jordan will be provided in due course. Organizations sending delegates to the 5th Session of the Provisional World Parliament must pay for the travel, hotel and other expenses of their delegates, but hotel costs are very low.

Please take the time to review the following checklist. In order to attend the 5th Session of the Provisional World Parliament, your sponsoring organization must be a member of the Global Ratification and Elections Network (GREN). Additionally, you must submit the following to WCPA Headquarters:

- Delegate Registration Form (with passport number and expiration date)

- \$25 Registration Fee (\$100 after Jan. 1)

In the spring of 1996, Margaret and I went to Togo with the objective of persuading President Eyadema and the Government of Togo to take the lead in ratifying the Constitution for the Federation of Earth. We were encouraged to make this trip because the political party of President Eyadema, Rassemblement du Peuple Togolais, had joined the Global Ratification and Elections Network, and so had the Parti Republicain Independant, led by Dominique Balouki. Thane Read of Arizona, one of the four original founders of our movement in 1958 (unhappily deceased, November, 1997), paid half the cost of our trip.

At the airport in Lome, Togo, we were royally welcomed mostly by members of Mr. Balouki's group. We were there for one week, and had meetings with Prime Minister Edem Kodjo, the Finance Minister, the President of the National Assembly, and leaders of several political parties, and a dinner given by Mr. Balouki. All of the meetings were very well arranged by Mr. Ayayi Adjangba, who deserves a gold medal for his dedicated work, who was able to make appointments with everybody except General Eyadema. Our meeting with Prime Minister Dr. Kodjo was featured by a one-half front page report in the main newspaper of Togo.

Photos on this page show our meetings with the Prime Minister, the Finance Minister, and one showing Margaret signing a letter to President Eyadema appealing for him to take leadership. But he never replied. Now in elections during June, opposition leader Gilchrist Olympio is reported to have won the election for President. He is the son of Togo's first elected President, Sylvanus Olympio. During a revolt in 1963, the elder Olympio was killed, and the son had to live in exile in Ghana. If Mr. Olympio is allowed to take office, it remains to be seen whether he will be more responsive to our appeals, which have widespread popular support in Togo, where more than 32 organizations are members of GREN.

WORLD YOUTH AND STUDENTS MOVEMENT TO ORGANIZE AND CARRY FORWARD A GLOBAL REVOLUTION FOR FEDERAL WORLD GOVERNMENT

We are aware that, at this moment, all people on earth are confronted daily with imminent and growing threats of universal catastrophe in nuclear war. At the same time, many other problems also urgently require solutions on a planetary scale if the people in many localities are to survive and prosper. Although this situation has persisted for many years and grown worse despite many protests since the end of World War II, there is very little chance that we can continue on the same collision course much longer without total disaster.

The obvious remedy, which leading thinkers have pointed out for several decades, is to establish a democratic federal world government with an elected parliament empowered to develop global solutions for the common problems of humanity. Protests against war armaments must be combined with the creation of world federation in order to escape destruction and build a peaceful human society on Earth. Therefore, real DIRECT ACTION is needed immediately by the young generations, the future leaders of the world, to establish a Provisional World Parliament, capable of solving world problems effectively. It is doubtful that human civilization on Earth can survive another ten years, or even five years, of such misdirection over world affairs, or of blindly pretending that the UN can be transformed to do what only a properly designed and constitutionally authorized Federal World Government could possibly do.

The Global Ratification and Elections Network (GREN) was organized three years ago to carry out the ratification campaign worldwide, to be followed by elections of delegates to the World Parliament convened under a ratified World Constitution. This global network should be strengthened and urgently carried forward to establish Federal World Government before the end of the year 2000.

Since the World Youth and Students Movement (WYSM) of GREN was established in October 1997, we have been trying to reach young people of the world with the essential approach of world government. The primary initiatives of WYSM are to make young people, the segment of the population with the most potential and creativity, understand the concept of a democratic federal world government and its urgency.

WYSM organizes and activates existing GREN youth and student groups toward this important cause. Additionally, we contact thousands of youth and student organizations and potential individuals to join our campaign towards a world revolution for absolute peace,

true human rights, and sustainable socioeconomic and cultural development.

Originally, we invited youth and student organizations to share their ideas and proposals with us. We also invited these organizations to name one representative to work with the Global Committee and one representative for the Regional Committee. We are happy to announce that we received tremendous response in favor of our proposals. We are now working to create ten regional committees for the WYSM.

In March, we conducted an informal poll among youth and student organizations worldwide to identify youth leaders' opinions in selecting a venue for the Fifth Session of the Provisional World Parliament and the concurrent World Youth and Students Assembly. A large number of youth leaders participated in the polling and we found that the majority (70%) preferred the Republic of Iraq to the other two options: Tanzania or Togo. Subsequently, a three member traveling committee visited Baghdad and had several meetings with the local host, Non-Aligned Students and Youth Organization (NASYO), and the Iraqi government. We finally reached an agreement to hold the Parliament in Baghdad, Iraq.

NASYO will cooperate in successfully holding the Parliament and concurrent Youth Assembly. We plan to organize the Assembly for two days. All participating GREN youth and students organizations, and many other new groups and individuals, will be invited to participate in the Assembly. We expect over one thousand youth delegates will attend.

Our goal is to establish the first stage of functioning of world government before the end of the year 2000. With the formation of the WYSM of GREN, our world movement has gained new hope. We believe this process will hasten the federal world government movement.

Our plan is to mobilize by educating young people about World Government and organizing them worldwide to start a revolutionary movement. Through education and organization, we can lead a world revolution. Young people have great potential and are among the most creative and productive workforce anywhere. Even with all the differences of language, color, and religion, many young people share a common desire for peace, love, and a poverty-free life. This common desire of the youth must be given practical shape and this is the demand of the day.

Young people are fighting evils in every corner of the globe for peace, progress, human rights, and development. They are voluntarily involving themselves, with the hope that a more just and equitable world may be realized in the days to come. Many of those efforts are in the interests of deprived people of the world. Some recent success stories include:

- Brave Indonesian students finally attained success. President Suharto resigned. We commend the Indonesian youth and students for their courage and determination to end the 32 year dictatorship of General Suharto. After weeks of relentless resistance, marred by blood sacrifices and popular revolt, they won an initial victory. Without their sacrifice and persistent struggle, it would have been impossible for this mass murderer to relinquish power after more than three decades of repression and brutal violation of human rights.

- Thousands flooded downtown Vancouver, Canada - the venue of the Fifth Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) leaders' Summit - on November 25, 1997, in protest of the continuing global trend of trade and investment liberalization, privatization, and deregulation. Drawing inspiration from the historic resistance highlighted during the Manila People's Conference Against Imperialist Globalization in 1996, the Canadian people registered their position: No to APEC. Activists joined from around the world.

- Many students died in Bangladesh in 1990, during their uncompromising movement against General Ershad and his nine year old autocratic military regime. After a very strong resistance, Bangladesh now has a democratic government.

- During the Fourteenth World Festival of Youth and Students held in Havana, Cuba, from July 28 to August 5, 1997, thousands of young people, from different parts of the globe, gathered voluntarily joining the anti-imperialist movement and furthering solidarity, peace, and friendship. The political dialogue took place during the festival in different forums. This event awakened more people to the urgency for global change.

Youth activists are aware of the connections between power imbalances, resource distribution, and environmental issues. They are spearheading world government issues and initiatives all over the world. Young people can effect change in the world if they are properly motivated, organized, and united. Admittedly, without active and complete participation of the youth force in the national and global process of the world movement, our efforts cannot make much headway.

Recently, I attended a World Conference of Ministers Responsible for Youth at the United Nations office in New York. This meeting was preparatory. I

will also attend the final meeting, the Third Session of the World Youth Forum of the United Nations System, August 2-6, 1998, in Braga, Portugal. About 500 delegates from youth and students movements worldwide will meet with UN representatives and other inter-governmental organizations to promote the meeting's theme: Youth Participation for Human Development. The key objective is to improve the channels of communication and increase cooperation between the UN, other inter-governmental organizations, and youth organizations. Each working group at the Forum will present recommendations to relevant organizations, as well as to the first-ever World Conference of Ministers Responsible for Youth, August 8-12 in Lisbon, which I will also be attending. The results will be presented to the UN General Assembly.

I will also be attending an international youth conference in Russia.

World Youth Expo: An exhibition of youth action will be organized at the Forum, accommodating exhibits from youth agencies, the UN, other inter-governmental organizations, non-governmental youth organizations, and the private sector.

A World Youth Festival '98 will be held in Lisbon. Thousands of young people are expected to attend.

WYSM will try to reach all youth and student leaders to exchange information regarding the movement for World Government. I will invite them to join GREN and to participate in the Fifth Session of the Provisional World Parliament and concurrent World Youth and Students Assembly in Baghdad. We hope our relentless initiatives to reach young leaders of the world will expand our worldwide network and strengthen our movement.

Again, our goal is to establish ten regional sections of World Youth and Students Movement before the end of this year and form a global executive committee for WYSM. We plan to organize collective demonstrations and maintain pressure on national governments until they support and ratify the Constitution for the Federation of Earth. We will form a national organizing committee to monitor and coordinate the movement at the national level, a regional center will be responsible at the regional level and provide all possible logistic support. The WYSM headquarters, with the assistance of GREN headquarters, will be coordinating the Global Revolutionary Movement of World Government. We intend that 1999 will be a year of demonstrations and pressuring governments to ratify.

We are hopeful and confident that the efforts of young people will be a success and we will see a World Government soon on Earth.

The Phytoplankton Project

to restore the atmospheric balance of oxygen and carbon dioxide

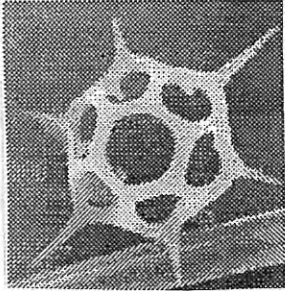


Photo of a Diatom (Phytoplankton)

IMPLEMENTATION OF WORLD LEGISLATIVE ACT #6

As many of our readers will know, World Legislative Act #6 was enacted as World Law at the Second Session of the Provisional World Parliament meeting in 1985, at New Delhi, India. The purpose of this act was to create the Emergency Earth Rescue Administration to carry out a coordinated worldwide emergency campaign on several major fronts concurrently, in order to overcome the increase of CO₂ before climatic and geological changes become irreversible.

Recognizing that recent research and demonstrations have proven the great potential for stimulating rapid phytoplankton growth by fertilization, the proposal for "massive mineralization and remineralization in selected areas of the oceans of Earth" was subsequently adopted at the 4th Session of the Provisional World Parliament, in September of 1996. However, it wasn't until the tragic passing from cancer of Margaret Ann Isely, Treasurer and long-time activist in the WCPA, that the *Phytoplankton Project* was launched under the auspices of the Margaret Ann Isely Foundation. Margaret ardently wanted fertilization of ocean phytoplankton to go forward.

The Dual Role of Photosynthesis

In its ideal state, Earth's atmosphere normally contains a balance of oxygen and carbon dioxide, which works to harmoniously sustain all forms of plant and animal life. Through the process of photosynthesis, plants, trees and plankton take in carbon dioxide and return oxygen to the atmosphere. However, the excess of climate changing carbon dioxide, which is known to occur at the end of inter-glacial periods when forests die and burn because of running out of essential minerals in the soil, is now exaggerated by the burning of fossil fuels, coupled by the rampant destruction of rainforests. All of this is upsetting the life-friendly inter-glacial atmospheric balance, and now threatens to destroy human life on Earth. It has also become apparent that, while carbon dioxide is on the increase, oxygen — conversely — is on the decline. Beyond retrieving the excess carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and averting catastrophic global climate change, the Phytoplankton Project may also serve to replenish atmospheric oxygen essential to preventing cancer and many diseases and mending Earth's ozone layer.

Efforts Underway

The Margaret Ann Isely Foundation is currently putting great energy toward the implementation of the *Phytoplankton Project*. Immediate plans include:

- The *First MORE OXYGEN FOR THE WORLD* Conference, to be held in San Antonio, Texas in July 1998, and subsequent international conferences on an annual basis.
- An extensive fund-raising and publicity campaign.
- The creation of an Oxygen Therapy Referral Guide, and a *Questions & Answers on Oxygen* booklet. (*Questions and Answers on the Phytoplankton Project* has already been completed.)
- The creation of an oxygen product line, a percentage of the profits to benefit the Margaret Ann Isely Foundation and, specifically, the Phytoplankton Project.
- The implementation of the preparatory stages of the Project, to include budget fulfillment, the build-up of a technical and operations staff and first ocean fertilization operations, as funds permit.
- Begin with the full acknowledgment that federal World Government is necessary to complete phytoplankton fertilization in Earth's oceans, administered by World Government.

DOCUMENTARY IN THE MAKING

A DOCUMENTARY FILM is in the works, focusing on the efforts to launch the Phytoplankton Project as the immediate solution to the current atmospheric crisis (excessive carbon dioxide and diminishing oxygen). A local production team headed by Pam Nelson will be producing the film. Californian, Dave Kelly (*Two Worlds* and *Cargoes and Cultures*), will be shooting and directing. The film will be shot in segments, as funds can be raised, and will be used for educational, promotional, and action purposes, as well as to raise larger funds for the Phytoplankton Project. The producers will also be targeting various film festivals, with the goal of reaching the largest possible audience.

Why More Oxygen?

One has only to hold one's breath for a few seconds to understand how dependent human beings are on oxygen to support all of their body functions. In fact, a mere four minutes without oxygen can cause permanent damage to the human brain, and ten minutes without can cause death.

Adequately oxygenated, the body is strong, energetic and disease-free — the mind is clear and sharp. Without adequate oxygen, however, various unpleasant symptoms can occur, ranging from fatigue, foggy mind and headaches to debilitating and life-threatening illness — all of which are often mistakenly attributed to other factors. There is growing evidence that the increasing rates of cancer and other diseases worldwide are directly linked to the decline in available oxygen.

*Why a Conference?**

The MORE OXYGEN FOR THE WORLD Conference was conceived as a forum to expedite full implementation of the Phytoplankton Project, which is described in detail in the book recently published by the Margaret Ann Isely Foundation, titled, "DOUBLE JEOPARDY AND THE PHYTOPLANKTON PROJECT". The conference also gives attention to various individual oxygen therapies to cope with cancer and other diseases from which individuals may be suffering, as well as to restore Earth's diminishing oxygen supplies so that everybody can get enough oxygen by normal breathing, while at the same time taking excess carbon dioxide out of the air. Other factors closely related to the main objectives are also given attention both for educational and action purposes.

Eighteen speakers, whom many consider foremost experts in their fields, are scheduled to address a wide variety of relevant topics in addition to the Phytoplankton Project, which include the Earth's declining oxygen supply and increasing CO₂ level, nutritional approaches to oxygen therapy, hyperbaric and other oxygen therapies, climate change and reforestation, and the necessity for alternative energy. Speakers include: **Dr. Stephen A. Levine**, eminent biochemist and President of Allergy Research; **Dr. Rashmi Mayur**, President, Global Futures Network and Environmental Consultant to the United Nations; **Dr. Kurt Donsbach**, Administrator of Santa Monica Hospital, and author of "Oxygen, Oxygen, Oxygen"; **Dr. Garry Gordon**, Physician, Founder of the International College for Advanced Longevity; and **Elizabeth Baker**, author of "The Unmedical Miracle Oxygen"; together with reports on Phytoplankton Fertilization projects.

Although the *First* MORE OXYGEN FOR THE WORLD Conference will be held in the United States on a national level, plans are underway to hold continuing conferences annually which will be designed for international participation and to carry out the necessary action.

TRIBUTE TO MARGARET ANN ISELY

I can think of no better way to describe the life and work of Margaret Isely than to quote Mahatma Gandhi, one of India's greatest leaders since the Buddha: "A small body of determined spirits fired by an unquenchable faith in their mission can alter the course of history." Margaret's mission to build a New World Order was fired by the unquenchable faith that humankind, in spite of so many crucifixions and so much sacrifice and sorrow, will one day establish a DEMOCRATIC FEDERAL WORLD GOVERNMENT that would end all wars, dissensions and tumults and enable:

"The world's great age to begin anew,
The golden years to return"

As Ann Sheesley from Illinois, the home state of the great Abraham Lincoln, she had already envisioned the course humanity must take to avoid the collision course Planet Earth was moving towards. She was haunted by the nightmare of death dealing atom bombs, the desertification of the earth, pollution, the population explosion and the increasing exploitation of man by man.

Margaret then had a tryst with destiny. She met and married Philip Isely, a man with an equal unquenchable faith that humanity can alter the course of history if there was fire and faith within them. Their collaboration of nearly fifty years is a tale which future ages will lavish paeans of praise.

There was no easy going for the newly married couple. Since 1948, raising a family of six children, finding jobs, building a home had to be done alongside the determination to reclaim Planet Earth for humanity. Many would have put self above service. No so, Margaret. She shouldered the task of finding personal needs for the family and building resources to fund the selfless aim of rescuing Planet Earth. She triumphed over troubles and tribulations, which were countless. Undeterred by the gathering storms around her, she allowed her husband freedom to work out his plans for a World Constitution and a World Parliament. The Builders Foundation formed in the year of their marriage and the Health Foods and Vitamin Business put the Iselys on the road to prosperity. Refusing to follow the usual path of using their profits in idle splendor, Margaret decided that the Iselys must share this with humanity.

She assumed the Treasurership of the World Constitution and Parliament Association with its many branches throughout the world. Events came thick and fast. To recite them is like a roll call for humanity. Margaret had a hand in every one of them:

The roll call is endless. While toiling in the daily task of running the household and the Vitamin Business, Margaret found ways and means of financing the many conferences that Philip was organizing. Providence blessed her with the continued expansion of her business. Margaret's crowning glory was her decision to sponsor the Commission to draft the Constitution for the Federation of Earth. As one of the Commission that sat for many months in Lakewood, Colorado, I can personally testify to how solicitous she was for the welfare of the Commission. At Kongresshaus, Innsbruck, where representatives of over 40 countries met and unanimously adopted the Constitution, Margaret shed tears in pure joy at this great step towards releasing humanity from the bondage of the national concept to the freedom of the global concept. More Nuclear Madness?

After the second world war, when the U.S. government, with the help of compliant scientists, decided to embark on testing and installing nuclear bombs, Lewis Mumford, the pre-eminent social analyst of those days, wrote: GENTLEMEN, YOU ARE MAD!

But the U.S. government with the help of compliant scientists and eager arms manufacturers and their labor unions, went madly along testing and deploying nuclear bombs – enough to annihilate all people on the planet a hundred times over again. And the U.S.S.R. joined in the stupidity race – as did England, France, and China.

Fortuitously, nuclear war has not yet happened, although many trillions of dollars worth of wealth has been squandered, which could have made the Earth a good place to live for all. Meanwhile, everybody today continues to live under conditions of total insecurity, even if blinded to this reality by either daily struggles for existence or by daily accumulations of material vanities.

Now the governments of both India and Pakistan have demonstrated their capabilities for madness and stupidity by each exploding their own nuclear bombs, to prove that they, too, can employ scientific talents to waste their resources and help make the world an even more unsafe place for living.

The governments of India and Pakistan have also demonstrated that some leaders of countries of the “third world” and of “developing” countries, cannot be depended upon any more than leaders of prior nuclear powers to lead the world wisely to establish the global institutions needed for enduring peaceful living for the residents of Planet Earth.

A glimmer of sanity was shown, however, by the government of India a few days after demonstrating its capability for insanity, by proposing a convention of all nations with nuclear capability or evident potential to negotiate terms for eliminating nuclear weapons – without discrimination. Later, Pakistan also gave a glimmer of sanity by unilaterally announcing a (temporary) moratorium on bomb testing, and proposed that India and Pakistan meet in China to negotiate differences. India’s proposal was instantly rejected by the U.S. government, which then led a meeting of the five previously recognized nuclear powers (which coincidentally are the five controlling members of the U.N. “Security” Council) to reconfirm their commitment to a monopoly of nuclear madness and insanity by insisting that only India and Pakistan must stop nuclear arming.

Actually, it may be remembered (by anybody with political memories longer than two moons) that the U.S. government bears the underlying responsibility for nuclear testing by India and Pakistan: When the nuclear test ban treaty was being negotiated a couple of years ago, India’s government said that India would not agree to a test ban unless the U.S.A., and others, agreed to set a time schedule for the elimination of ALL nuclear weapons. The U.S.A. refused to consider such a ridiculous proposal. India and Pakistan, therefore, refused to sign the test ban treaty. The terms of this test ban treaty, which President Clinton made a great public show of signing (to the applause of the peace movement) are that it becomes invalid if nations with nuclear bombs or suspected nuclear potential – specifically, India and Pakistan – do not sign.

With the manifest demonstration of nuclear madness by India and Pakistan resulting from the earlier refusal of the U.S.A. to negotiate a timetable to get rid of all nuclear bombs, the U.S.A. (and all other treaty signers) are thankfully released from abiding by the treaty which they signed, and can now go ahead with impunity to resume their active insanity by further testing, improvement (?) and deployment of nuclear weapons – with impunity, that is, except for further endangering the lives of everybody on the planet. (Incidentally, the U.S.A. never stopped testing by computer simulations.)

Really, and in practical terms, there is only one solution to the problem of nuclear bombs, and that is: **UNIVERSAL AND COMPLETE DISARMAMENT UNDER FEDERAL WORLD GOVERNMENT**, which can provide the means for peaceful solutions to world problems, achieved by a fairly representative World Parliament, as defined by the Constitution for the Federation of Earth. The practical necessity for accelerating the establishment of constitutional Federal World Government is underlined every day by the total insanity of continuing the present international disorder, horrifically dramatized by nuclear bombs. Will the next sessions of the Provisional World Parliament be able to effectively get world government started and first stage functioning before the end of the year 2000?
