Rhodesia Bush War, 1966-1980

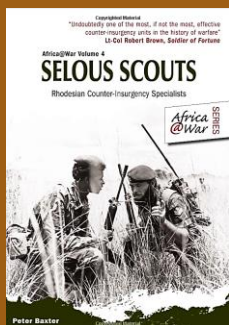

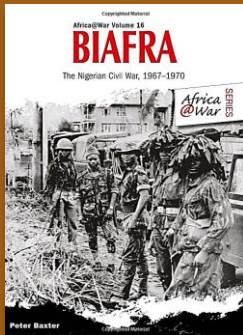

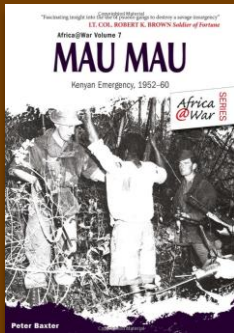

Mau Mau, Kenyan Emergency 1952-60

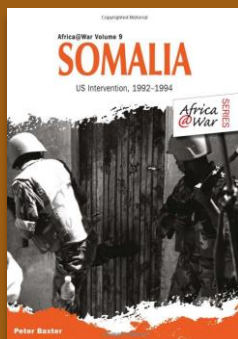

Somalia, US Intervention 1992-1994



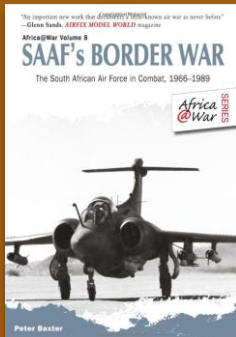

SAAF's Border War 1966-1989

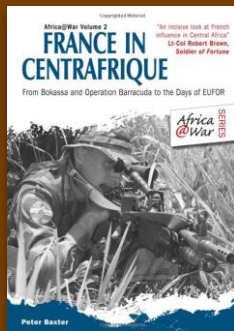

France in Centrafrique, French Intervention

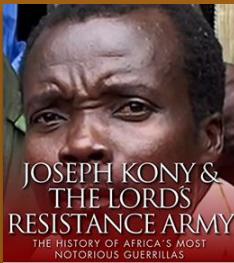

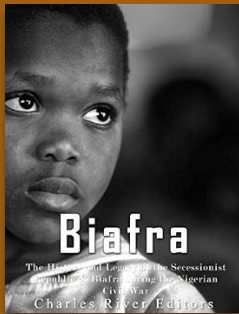

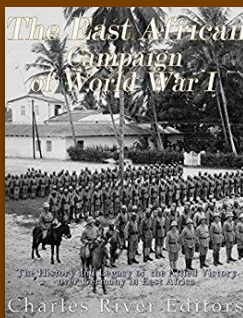

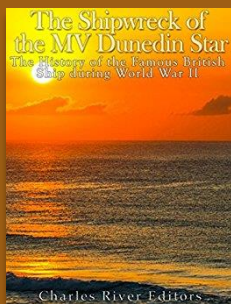

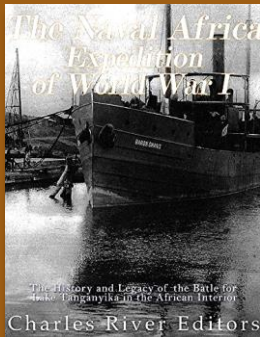
