In the early 1900's, the Utsalady pioneer waterfront had a mill, blacksmith shop, cookhouse and what was known as Bummer's Hall. Utsalady village entertainment besides the Saturday night dances featured croquet as a favorite game.



Later the waterfront became a ghost town with a population of two. The town revived in the 1920's with the popularity of vacation resorts.

At the history tour a man named Allen Daniels wanted to share a story with me. He was a grandchild of Ralph & Mable Larsen, who lived 3 houses down the ladies aid building. Allen recalled the story of how when he was 3 years old, staying with his grandparents, he had gotten away from their home. He had walked down the road to the pond (the swamp), which was on the corner of Essex street and Utsalady Road. 65 years ago the blackberries were not overgrown like they are now.

He must have been curious about something in the pond (or swamp). He walked to the edge of the pond and fell into the water. Our dad's dog must of heard the toddler, he barked frantically, enough for our Dad, Babe Mellum, to see what he was barking about. There in the pond was a toddler who couldn't get out. Our 6 '4" Norwegian father jumped into action to rescue the little guy and returned him to his grandparents. Allen Daniels is forever grateful for his rescue from the swamp. He lives to tell the story now in his 70's. Our lives are meant to be lived and to help one another. Now our Dad had never shared that story. He was sorta like a gentle giant, but when necessary he was a man of action whether that was on Camano Island or in France during World War 2.
