Cookie Crumbs

The word "cookie" is of Dutch origin, from the word *koekje* meaning little cake. The origins of the British cookie, biscuit, means twice cooked and goes back to the days when bakers put slices of newly baked bread back into the oven, so that it dried out completely. This really

was a method of preservation, for it enabled the cookies to be kept a long time. It wasn't until the beginning of the last century that the habit died out and the quality and variety of biscuits improved dramatically. We call them cookies when they are sweet, crackers when savory, while in Britain both are called biscuits. What we call biscuits the British call scones. We all agree on the word for muffins.
