1616	John Winter	Monhegan Island	Master of the "David" fisherman from Plymouth, Eng
1628	Thomas Purchase	Brunswick (Pejepscot)	Established town. Kin of Rev. Robert Jordan
1628	Walter Bagnal	Richmond Island	Grower-farmer, killed by Indians, Oct. 3, 1631
1631	R. Trelawny/M. Goodyear	Plymouth, Devonshire	Granted Richmond Island and Cape Elizabeth
1631	John Winter	Richmond Island	Named Agent for Trelawny/Goodyear grant
1632	R. Tucker/G. Cleves	Spurwink	Ejected by John Winter for Trelawny grant rights
1635	Trelawny Expedition	Richmond Island	Supply ship, "leaky ole" <i>Speedwell</i> arrives
1636	Trelawny/ Winter	Isle of Shoals	Owned and managed fish house at Isle of Shoals
1637	Rev. Richard Gibson	Richmond Island	Episcopal Priest sent by Trelawny as minister
1638	Rev. Robert Jordan	Dorsetshire/Devonshire	Departs for "Maine" colony. Lives with Thom. Purchase
1640	Rev. Richard Gibson	Richmond Island/Saco	Removed from Richmond Island and area ministry
1640	Rev. Robert Jordan	Richmond Island	Installed as new Anglican priest. Moved from Brunswick
1640	Rev. Robert Jordan	Isle of Shoals	Anglican ministry to the "Shoalers"
1641	Rev. Robert Jordan	Isle of Shoals	Continued ministry at the Isle of Shoals
1642	English Civil War	England	Trelawny political prisoner, died in 1643
1642	Rev. Richard Gibson	Isle of Shoals	Preaching at Isle of Shoals, prosecuted by Massachusetts
1643	R. Jordan/Sarah Winter	Richmond Island	Married
1645	John Winter	Richmond Island	Death. Was married to Joane Boaden (Boudan, Bowden)
1645	John Jordan	Richmond Island	Born. 1st to Robert and Sarah. (m). Eliz. Styleman. 5 kids
1648	Robert and Sarah Jordan	Richmond Is./ Cape Eliz.	Awarded the Winter (Trelawny) Estate
1649	Dominicus Jordan	Richmond Island	2nd son Born. Killed 8/10/1703 by Indians
1650	Robert Jordan	Richmond Island	3rd son Born. Died 1715. (m) Elizabeth Harvey
1654	Rev. Robert Jordan	Boston/Isle of Shoals	Arrested by Mass. Puritans for baptizing and marrying
1655	Jedediah Jordan	Richmond Island	4th son Born. (m) Abigail. Had 9 children in Kittery
1660	Samuel Jordan	Richmond Island	5th son. Born (m) Mary __. In Kittery. Had 3 Children.
1663	Rev. Robert Jordan	Boston/Isle of Shoals	Arrested by Mass. Puritans for Episcopal Church rites
1663	Jeremiah Jordan (Frenchy)	Richmond Is./Spurwink	6th Son Born. (m) Deborah Bickford. 2 Children
1675	King Philips War	Falmouth	Thomas Purchase home robbed by Indians
1675	King Philips War	Spurwink Plantation	June. Armed raid. Jordans escape by boat to Great Island
1675	King Philips War	Spurwink River Ferry	Fatality of Ambrose Bowden, same Indian raid as Jordans
1679	Rev. Robert Jordan	New Castle	Died at age 68
1685	Dominicus Jordan	Spurwink Plantation	Inherited 1000 A. Wife Hannah and family rebuilt home
1703	Dominicus and John	Spurwink Plantation	August 10, Killed, Families to Canada as hostages (Queen Anne's War)
