Creation of the World

Scripture: Genesis 1:1-2:3

God creates the heavens and the earth in six days, culminating in the creation of humanity in His image. On the seventh day, He rests, establishing the Sabbath.

Creation of Humanity

Scripture: Genesis 1:26-27

God creates mankind in His image, both male and female, giving them dominion over the earth.

The Garden of Eden

Scripture: Genesis 2:8-15

God placed Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, providing for their needs and commanding them not to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

The Fall of Man

Scripture: Genesis 3:1-7

Tempted by the serpent, Eve eats the forbidden fruit and gives some to Adam. Their disobedience leads to sin entering the world and the consequences of their actions.

Consequences of Sin

Scripture: Genesis 3:14-19

God pronounces curses on the serpent, Eve, and Adam, highlighting the brokenness that sin brings into creation.

Cain and Abel

Scripture: Genesis 4:1-16

Cain and Abel, the sons of Adam and Eve, bring offerings to God. Cain's jealousy leads to him murdering Abel, resulting in further consequences for humanity.

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Week 1 (cont'd)

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The Flood

Scripture: Genesis 6:5-8:22

God sees the wickedness of humanity and decides to send a flood to cleanse the earth. Noah is chosen to build an ark and preserve his family and pairs of every animal.

The Tower of **Babel**

Scripture: Genesis 11:1-9

Humanity attempts to build a tower to reach the heavens, leading God to confuse their language and scatter them across the earth, demonstrating the limits of human ambition against divine authority.

Job's Character and Prosperity

Scripture: Job 1:1-3

Job is described as a blameless and upright man who fears God and shuns evil. He is wealthy and has a large family, symbolizing his blessings and favor from God.

Satan **Challenges Job**

Scripture: Job 1:6-12

In a heavenly court, Satan challenges Job's integrity, suggesting that Job is faithful only because of his blessings. God allows Satan to test Job's faith.

Job's Suffering

Scripture: Job 1:13-19

Job experiences devastating loss: his livestock, servants, and children are killed or taken away, yet he mourns without cursing God.

Job's Response to Suffering

Scripture: Job 1:20-22

Job tears his robe and shaves his head in mourning, but he worships God, saying, "The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."

Further Testing

Scripture: Job 2:1-6

Satan again challenges Job's faithfulness, claiming that if Job's health is affected, he will curse God. God allows Satan to afflict Job physically but spares his life.

Job's Friends Arrive

Scripture: Job 2:11-13

Job's three friends—Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar—come to comfort him but are initially silent in their grief when they see his suffering.

Job's Lament

Scripture: Job 3:1-10

Job laments his birth, expressing deep anguish and questioning why he is suffering despite his righteousness.

Job's Dialogue with Friends

Scripture: Job 4-16

Job discusses with his friends, who argue that his suffering must be a punishment for sin. Job defends his integrity and pleads for an audience with God to understand his suffering.
