God's Challenge

Scripture: Job 40:1-14

God continues challenging Job, asking if he can truly contend with the Almighty. God questions Job's understanding and power, emphasizing divine wisdom and strength.

Description of Behemoth

Scripture: 40:15-24

God describes the behemoth, a powerful and untamable creature, as a demonstration of His unmatched creative power.

Description of Leviathan

Scripture: 41:1-34

God describes another powerful creature, the leviathan, highlighting its strength and the futility of humans trying to subdue it. This further illustrates God's supreme power over creation.

Job's Response and Repentance

Scripture: Job 42:1-6

Job humbly responds to God, acknowledging his lack of understanding and repenting for questioning God's wisdom.

Restoration of Job's Fortunes

Scripture: Job 42:7-17

God rebukes Job's friends for their inaccurate portrayal of Him and instructs them to offer sacrifices. Job prays for his friends, and God restores Job's fortunes, granting him double what he had before. Job is blessed with a long life, witnessing four generations.

Call of Abram

Scripture: Genesis 12:1-9

God calls Abram to leave his homeland and promises to make him a great nation. Abram obeys and travels to Canaan, where God reiterates His promise.

Abram in Egypt

Scripture: Genesis 12:10-20

A famine leads Abram to Egypt, where he deceives Pharaoh about Sarai being his sister. Pharaoh discovers the truth and sends Abram away.

Abram and Lot Separate

Scripture: Genesis 13:1-8

Abram and Lot part ways to avoid conflict over grazing land. Lot chooses the fertile plains of Jordan, while Abram settles in Canaan. God reaffirms His promise to Abram.

Abram Rescues Lot

Scripture: Genesis 14:1-24

Lot is captured during a battle among kings. Abram rescues him and is blessed by Melchizedek, king of Salem. Abram refuses a reward from the king of Sodom.

God's **Covenant with Abram**

Scripture: Genesis 15:1-21

God reassures Abram, promising him descendants as numerous as the stars. God establishes a covenant, symbolized through a sacrificial ritual.

Hagar and Ishmael

Scripture: Genesis 16:1-16

Sarai, barren, gives her maidservant Hagar to Abram. Hagar conceives Ishmael but is mistreated by Sarai and flees. God instructs her to return, promising blessings for Ishmael.

Covenant of Circumcision

Scripture: Genesis 17:1-27

God renames Abram as Abraham and Sarai as Sarah, promising them a son, Isaac. God establishes circumcision as a sign of the covenant.

Promised Son & Intercession of Sodom

Scripture: Genesis 18:1-33

Three visitors inform Abraham that Sarah will bear a son. Sarah laughs in disbelief but is reassured. Abraham pleads with God to spare Sodom if righteous people are found there.

Destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah (

Scripture: Genesis 19:1-29

Angels rescue Lot and his family from Sodom, which is destroyed due to its wickedness. Lot's wife looks back and turns into a pillar of salt.

Lot's Daughters

Scripture: Genesis 19:30-38

Lot's daughters scheme to preserve their family line, resulting in the births of Moab and Ammon.

Abraham and Abimelech

Scripture: Genesis 20:1-18

Abraham deceives Abimelech, claiming Sarah is his sister. God reveals the truth to Abimelech in a dream, and he returns Sarah to Abraham.

Birth of Isaac & Hagar/Ishmael Sent Away

Scripture: Genesis 21:1-34

Sarah gives birth to Isaac, fulfilling God's promise. Ishmael and Hagar are sent away but are promised a future by God. Abraham makes a covenant with Abimelech at Beersheba.

Sacrifice of Isaac

Scripture: Genesis 22:1-19

God tests Abraham's faith by asking him to sacrifice Isaac. An angel intervenes, and a ram is provided as a substitute.

Isaac and Rebekah

Scripture: Genesis 24:1-67

Abraham's servant, under oath, finds Rebekah as a wife for Isaac. The marriage is arranged as a result of divine guidance.

Birth of Esau & Jacob

Scripture: Genesis 25:19-34

Isaac and Rebekah have twin sons, Esau and Jacob. Esau sells his birthright to Jacob for a meal.

Jacob & Esau

Scripture: Genesis 27:1-46

Jacob, with Rebekah's help, deceives Isaac to receive Esau's blessing. Esau vows to kill Jacob, prompting Rebekah to send Jacob away to her brother Laban.

Jacob's Dream at Bethel

Scripture: Genesis 28:1-22

On his way to Laban, Jacob dreams of a ladder reaching to heaven and receives God's promise of blessing. He sets up a pillar and vows to serve God.

Jacob, Leah, & Rebecca

Scripture: Genesis 29:1-35

Jacob arrives in Haran, meets Rachel, and falls in love. He works seven years for her father Laban to marry her but is deceived into marrying Leah first. He works another seven years for Rachel. Leah and Rachel's Children Leah bears Jacob four sons: Reuben, Simeon, Levi, and Judah, as God sees her unloved status.
