Recovery Housing

As part of their Rebuilding HOPE expansion project, Great Lakes Recovery Centers (GLRC) is opening a recovery house for women in Sault Ste. Marie. Anne's House (named in memory of a former GLRC employee) will provide a safe and supportive environment for women taking the next step in their recovery journeys. Residents can bring their children (up to age 11) to live with them. Recovery Housing requires residents to engage in outpatient and case management services, attend at least four self-help group meetings weekly, and follow other house rules.
