#### I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to set out the process for and criteria relating to establishment of Board Committees.

## II. POLICY STATEMENT

The Board believes that most Board business should be processed in committees to enable the full Board to be more efficient and effective.

## III. CREATION OF COMMITTEES

- A. A resolution approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board may establish committees having the authority of the Board in the management of the business of Lafayette Charter School to the extent provided in the resolution.
- B. Committees are subject at all times to the direction and control of the Board.
- C. The resolution creating the committee shall include the specific charge to the committee.

# IV. MEMBERSHIP

A. A committee must consist of one or more persons, who need not be Board members. Committee members shall be appointed by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board members present at a meeting.

#### V. MEETINGS AND MINUTES

- A. If a committee includes a quorum of the Board of Lafayette Charter School, it is presumed that the meeting is subject to the requirements of the Open Meeting Law.
- B. If the Board of Lafayette Charter School delegates its authority to a committee to make binding decisions on its behalf, the committee meetings are subject to the requirements of the Open Meeting Law.
- C. Minutes, if any, of committee meetings must be made available upon request to members of the committee and to the Board.
